MEETING OF JANUARY 8, 1940

The five hundred fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 8th day of January, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Burdick.

Present: Mayor Burdick, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Roberts and Rudder, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Stanley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the five hundred second and five hundred third regular meetings of the Council, held respectively on the 11th and 22nd days of December, 1939, were each read and were each approved as read.

The treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Recorder's annual report was read and ordered filed.

The applications of Dorothy Miller and Vivian Farrington for the position of City Stenographer were read. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Gillem that Vivian Farrington be employed as City Stenographer on a month-to-month basis at a salary of \$15 per month. Motion carried and so ordered.

Father Bernard requested the vacation of 24th Street in Ischarner Addition. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Kirkpatrick that proceedings relative to the vacation of 24th Street in Ascharner Addition be initiated. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Gillem that Water Superintendent Bevington be employed for the year 1940 as Water Superintendent and Street Commissioner at a salary of \$150 per month. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Kirkpatrick that the position of traffic officer be dispensed with until as the City Council deems fit to hire a traffic officer, and that traffic officer Stanley's services as such traffic officer be terminated on January 31, 1940. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rudder and seconded by Gillem that the gasoline and oil bill of Officer Stanley to Milwaukie Service Station be paid. Motion carried and so ordered.
