

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DECEMBER 26TH, 1913.

An adjourned meeting of the regular one hundred forty-first (141) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above-named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present: Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee, Treasurer Bolstad and Marshal Reed. The Recorder being absent, the Mayor appointed L. H. Campbell Recorder Pro. Tem. Mr. Scott asked the Council to make some changes in the contract for the improvement of De Witt Street as drawn up. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were authorized to make such changes in said contract as in their discretion they deemed advisable. The contract of the P. R. L. & P. Co. for lighting for 1914, was referred to the Light Committee.

Upon motion duly made and carried ordinance No. 98 was taken up for the first reading, the ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee; Nays, none. Absent, Councilman King. Ordinance No. 98 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 98 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee; Nays, none. Absent, councilman King. Ordinance No. 98 passed the second reading. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 98 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee; Nays, none. Absent Councilman King. Ordinance No. 98 passed the third and final reading. Moved by councilman Loeding and seconded by councilman Mitchell that a copy of the liquor ordinance No. 98 be posted in each saloon. Carried. The objections of some of the property owners along Harrison Street to the Viewers report on th proposed widening of Harrison were read and referred to the Street Committee for consideration.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

The one hundred forty-second (142) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above-named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Recorder Mathews, Councilmen Mitchell, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the one hundred forty-first (141) regular meeting of the Town Council held on the 9th day of December, 1913, and the minutes of the call meeting held on the 15th day of Dec. 1913, and also the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the one hundred forty first regular meeting of the Town Council held on the 26th day of December, 1913, were read and approved as read.

The following bills were allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the several funds in payment of the same:

Estimate No. 4 of the City Engineer of the work performed by the Montague-O'Reilly Company on Front Street was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Front Street fund for \$5137.16, the amount due the said Company in payment of the same. The Recorder was also instructed to draw a warrant on the Front Street fund in favor of the Montague-O'Reilly Company for \$126.62, the amount due the said Company for extra work performed on Front Street.

A communication from Montague-O'Reilly Company in regard to extra work on Front Street was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the said Company to proceed with the work with the understanding that they shall be paid the actual cost of the material used, plus 10% profit, in accordance with the terms of their contract with the Town. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the offer of Mr. Phillips to clear the extended portion of Laurel Avenue for the timber on it was accepted.
