A special meeting was held on the 23rd day of January, 1934, at the call of Mayor Miller for the purpose of taking up Ordinance Number 338.

Present: Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh Recorder Adams and Marshal Keck.

Ordinance No. 338 entitled "An Ordinance authorizing and providing for the issue and sale of General Obligation Civic Works bonds, dated as of February 23, 1934, of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, providing the form thereof and declaring an emergency" was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. The roll call being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance Number 338 passed the first reading. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Sanders that the rules be suspended and that Ordinance Number 338 be taken up for the second time and be read by title only. Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance No. 338 was read for the second time by title only and the roll call on Ordinance 338 being taken the following result was had. Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance Number 338 passed the second reading. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Dean that the rules be suspended and that Ordinance Number 338 be taken up for the third time and be read by title only. Vote on the motion. Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance Number 338 was read for the third time by title only and the roll call being taken thereon the following result was had: Ayes: Dean Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance No. 338 passed the third and final reading.

No further business coming before the meeting it was adjourned.

February 9, 1934.

A special meeting was held on the 9th day of February, 1934, pursuant to the call of Mayor Miller and in order to conduct a hearing on the Vacation of Long's Addition in Milwaukie. Present Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dell, Sanders and Walsh, Recorder Adams and Marshal Keck.

The Mayor opened the hearing by stating the purposes of the meeting and reading the petition seeking the vacation of Long's Addition and thereupon reading a remonstrance against the proposed vacation presented by H.G. Coates and others. The matter was opened for discussion and Mr. Coates stated that those opposed to the vacation would withdraw their opposition if provision were made for making Fortieth Street sixty feet in width and if some provision were made for extending Thirty-seventh street through the property. Mr. T.E. Zanders and Mr. A.A. Zanders owners of the property appearing in support of the petition for vacation stated that they would provide twenty feet for a roadway on the westerly side of Long's Addition and that they would also provide sufficient property to make Fortieth Street sixty feet wide in replatting the property.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Walsh that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance providing for the vacation of Long's Addition conditioned upon the establishment by the owners of twenty feet on the westerly side of Long's Addition for a roadway and making provision for constituting Fortieth Street a sixty foot thoroughfare on the easterly side of Long's Addition. Ayes: Dell, Sanders and Walsh; Noes: None. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.
