SPECIAL MEETING OF JANUARY 25, 1960

A special meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie was held on the twenty-fifth day of January, 1960, for the purpose of a hearing on the question of annexing contiguous property as listed in Ordinance Number 779, opening bids for fire fighting apparatus and such other business necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was opened at seven-thirty o'clock P.M. and was called to order by Mayor Earl Clay.

The roll call showed those present were Mayor Earl Clay; Councilmen Peter Mortensen, E. H. Aebi and Theron Sedgwick. City Manager Leonard Mullan, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin. Absent: Councilman James Howard.

Bids for furnishing the City with a new piece of fire fighting apparatus were opened and read as follows:

MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF JANUARY  
26th, 1960

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the twenty-sixth day of January, 1960, for the purpose of reviewing and investigating Mutual Assistance between the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District, Oak Lodge Fire District and Milwaukie Fire Department, and such other business necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay at 7:30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Clay; Councilmen Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick; Manager Mullan and Attorney Sheldhal. Absent: Councilman Howard and Clerk Martin.

After viewing the Mutual Assistance Agreement it was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Aebi that the Mayor be authorized to sign the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Aebi and seconded by Mortensen that Fire Chief Lillis, as head of the Civil Defense in Milwaukie, be authorized to make application for match money to purchase radios for the Fire and Police Departments. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 780, AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Clay, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance No. 780 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, on motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
