

MEETING OF JANUARY 22, 1951. (Cont'd)

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that easements for intercepting sewers be paid, subject to the approval of the City Attorney. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that the Manager be authorized to employ Mr. V. Corti to put culverts under City of Milwaukee Railroad in Kellogg Park. Motion carried and so ordered.

There was discussion with regard to license fees charged for pin ball and other coin operated machines. It was decided that Manager Telford would ascertain what other cities were doing along this line, and report to the Council.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 546 AN ORDINANCE prescribing the rates on stand-by water service for fire protection sprinkler systems; and regulating the use thereof and payment of charges for same, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 546 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Councilman Taylor suggested that as this was the time of year to prune trees, that the City have the trees overhanging the street at the north of the City Hall grounds, pruned to proper height over street and sidewalk, and that overhanging trees throughout the City be required to be properly pruned to conform to the ordinance.

Upon Motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING OF FEBRUARY 5, 1951

A special meeting of the Council was held on the fifth day of February, 1951.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

The meeting was called for the purpose of considering the acquisition of a piece of fire equipment, and such other business as was necessary to come before the Council at this time.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Taylor, Klein and Mullan; Manager Telford, Treasurer Dillery and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Norbeck and Attorney Kirkpatrick.

Mr. John W. Jones, Chairman of Civilian Defense for the Milwaukee Area, explained to the Council some of the requirements for fire equipment that will shortly be confronting the City. It appears that if these requirements are not met, the insurance rates in all parts of the City are due to raise. Mr. Jones also told the Council of a piece of equipment which was war surplus, which was suitable to our needs. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that the City purchase a piece of fire equipment subject to the following conditions

1. That Civilian Defense contribute one-half the cost of equipment.
 2. That City of Milwaukee's share is to be paid over a period of five years.
 3. That first payment is to fall due not before July 10, 1951
 4. That total cost of equipment shall not exceed \$19,000.00
- Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of curb cuts, on Harrison Street, for driveways for Safeway Stores, was discussed. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Taylor that the proposed curb cuts on Harrison Street east of Main Street, for Safeway Stores, be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
