

SPECIAL MEETING OF FEBRUARY 14, 1958

A special meeting of the Council of the City of milwaukie, was held for the purpose of a hearing on the annexation of territories in Gloverland, Joseph Kellogg D.L.C., Birkemeier Heights, Milwaukie Heights and George Crow, D.L.D. on the fourteenth day of February, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

The Mayor called for protests or objections of any citizen to the annexation of any of the territories above named and as listed in the published and posted notices of this hearing.

The question was brought up as to where or not these territories, if annexed, should be withdrawn from the Oak Lodge Sanitary District. Under discussion it was suggested that the area in the George Crow D.L.C. might be better served with sewers by the Sanitary District, than if these services were constructed by the City under a Local Improvement District.

Several of the owners of properties, who had requested and consented to the annexation of their properties, were present, and when canvassed for their opinions, some were confused as to what would be the most advantageous to them. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that this meeting would adjourn until Monday, February 17, 1958, in order that interested parties could obtain more information on the question.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned to reppen at eight o'clock P.M. on February 17, 1958.

ADJOURNED MEETING OF FEBRUARY 17, 1958

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held on the seventeenth day of February, 1958, for the purpose of continuing the hearing on the annexation of territories in Gloverland, Joseph Kellogg D.L.C., Birkemeier Heights, Milwaukie Heights, Milwaukie Park and George Crow D.L.C. and such other matters as was necessary to be taken care of at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

The Mayor reopened the hearing on the annexation of the above mentioned territories.

A petition, signed by eighteen property owners in Milwaukie Park and George Crow D.L.C. who had petitioned for annexation, was read, as follows:

"We, the undersigned, represent that we are record owners of real property contiguous and adjacent to the City of Milwaukie, who have petitions for annexation pending, and further respectfully petition this Honorable Body to take immediate steps to withdraw our real property from the Oak Lodge Sanitary District. It is our desire to withdraw our petition for annexation if the withdrawal of our property from the sanitary district cannot be completed in time to avoid encumbering our property with the proposed sanitary district bonds."

A telegram, from A. C. Wherry, confirming that he wished his application withdrawn unless the territory was withdrawn from Oak Lodge Sanitary District, was read.
