Committee on plumbing recommended that F.H.Lechler and J.M.Snider should be granted a permit for plumbing.

The Committee on Lighting reported that they had reviewed the situation and the petition for Lights and suggested that lights be placed as follows: Arc light at the corner of Second and Whitman Streets, Arc Light on Oak Street and Railroad Avenue, Arc Light at Railroad Avenue and Maple Street; Arc Light at Railroad Avenue and Cleveland Street; Arc light at the corner of Harrison Street at the east line of Shindler's residence; Arc light at the corner of Palm and Cleveland Street. And that three incandescent lights to be placed at intervals, commencing at the south end of the bridge crossing Kellogg Lake and extending in a Northerly direction.

The Recorder was instructed to notify the P.R.L.& P.Co. to install the said Lights at once. The recorder was instructed to notify Kerr and Fish to report the number of faucets in use at the next regular meeting of the Council, March 2, 1911.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON MARCH 2, 1911.

The Council of Milwaukie met on the above date pursuant to adjournment of meeting of Feb. 15, 1911. Rolled called showed the following officers present: Mayor, Philip Streib; Recorder W.A. Hansen; Marshal Davis; Councilman J.R.Kelso, Warren Knight, W.F.Lehman, and Chas. T. Stockton.

A petition containing 116 names filed by A.C.Ulrich for certain amendments to Ordinance Number 49 and also a letter were read and after some discussion of same upon motion by Lehman and 2nd by *Stockton* ~~Streib~~, it was ordered that Ordinance stand as posted.

Rolled called showed the vote to be as follows: Aye, Knight, Kelso, Lehman and Stockton. Nays none. So the amendments were defeated.

Ordinance Number 49 was then taken up for passage, read and on motion received the unanimous vote of the Council and was duly declared adopted. The plans and specifications for estimates of the work to be done at the cost thereof, for the improvement of Main Street, according to petitions, therefore were submitted by the City Engineer and exhibited to the Council and upon motion the following resolution was read and adopted by the council and ordered posted as required by the City Charter:
