SPECIAL MEETING OF FEBRUARY 16, 1959

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, was held on the sixteenth day of February, 1959 for the purpose of a hearing on the assessment for the Sellwood Gardens sewers and trunk line sewers and for such other business as was necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the assessment for the Sellwood Gardens trunk line and sanitary sewers and called for protests or objections to the same. The Clerk read nine written protests, the majority of which were objections to the condition of the streets following the laying of the

sewers, others were inquiries as to how the assessment was computed and as to how it was to be paid. There were no verbal objections to the assessment. The Mayor closed the hearing.

Ordinance Number 742 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Clay that Ordinance Number 742 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 742 AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the construction of a trunk line sewer and sanitary sewers in Sellwood Gardens, Ross Addition to Sellwood, Ross and Walker Addition and Milwaukie Industrial Park, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 742 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 741, AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 741 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, on motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING OF FEBRUARY 24, 1959

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held for the purpose of considering the question of annexing territories now completely surrounded by the city, and such other business as was necessary to come before the Council at this time, on the twenty-fourth day of February, 1959.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

It was moved by Howard and seconded by Clay that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 4-1959

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE CALLING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, COUNTY OF CLACKAMAS, AND STATE OF OREGON, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE FOR THEIR ADOPTION OR REJECTION AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CHARTER WHICH WOULD ACCOMPLISH THE ANNEXATION OF LAND AND TERRITORY NOW SURROUNDED BY THE CORPORATE LIMITS AND BOUNDARIES OF SAID CITY WHICH HAS NOT HERETO° BEFORE BEEN ANNEXED TO SAID CITY, ALL AS PROVIDED BY ORS.222.750.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has determined that there exists within the corporate limits of said city and completely surrounded by the boundaries of said city certain tracts of land and territory which are not a part of the city of Milwaukie, Oregon, and which have never been heretofore annexed to the City of Milwaukie Oregon, and,

WHEREAS, the tracts of land and territory hereinabove referred to are described as follows:
