TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE OREGON, FEBRUARY 28th 1912.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held in the Town Hall Feb. 28th. Roll Called showed the following officers present Councilmen Knight, Stockton and Behman, Recorder Bolstad and Marshall Davis.

In the absence of the Mayor the meeting was called to order by the Recorder.

The meeting having been called for the purpose of discussing the ~~purpose of~~ authorizing the bonding of the Town for \$5000 in order to secure and purchase better fire fighting apparatus and for the purpose of housing same in central and convenient place. The proposition was open for discussion by all parties interested.

The proposition having been discussed it was moved by Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Stockton that an ordinance be drawn and posted authorizing issuance of bonds to the amount of \$5000.00 for the purpose of purchasing fire fighting apparatus and housing of same. Carried.

The next question brought up for discussion was the sewer proposition. Mr. Kelsie an engineer of Portland submitted a proposition stating that he would survey the Town, establish grades and lay it out in perfect sewer system, and furnish blue prints of same with details marked for \$600. And in event the contract was let he was willing to superintend the laying of sewers for 5 % of contract price, this to apply on the \$600 until that amount was refunded to the Town.

It was moved by Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Stockton that the proposition be referred to the Street Committee for investigation and to report at the next meeting.
