

SPECIAL MEETING OF MARCH 29, 1954

Meeting of the Council convened at 8:00 P.M. on March 29th, 1954

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright
Manager Sperr, Attorney Kirkpartick. Absent: Recorder Martin.

Notice of purpose of meeting as published in the Milwaukie Review was read.

All registered voters were called upon to express their sentiments in regard to the annexation, of the territory described in said notice. All present were in favor of the annexation.

Ordinance Number 597, providing for the annexation of said territory was read for the first time. Motion of Councilman Clay, seconded by Councilman Klein, that Ordinance Number 597 be passed to second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Bernard Davis, auditor of the City of Milwaukie, submitted a proposed form of monthly financial statement, and reported on the matter of the audit which he was making.

The form of the monthly financial statement was approved by the Council.

Motion by Shook, seconded by Wright that meeting adjourn. Motion carried and so ordered.

MEETING OF APRIL 12, 1954

COUNCIL CHAMBER

842nd MEETING

The eight hundred forty-second regular meeting of the Council was held on the twelfth day of April 1954.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright; Manager Sperr, Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred forty-first regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-second day of March, 1954, were approved as written.

The matter of refunding a sewer assessment collected on a sixty foot intersection of 33rd Street in Roseland Addition, vacated, was again laid before the Council. (See minutes of March 8 and 22, 1954) Mr. Rickman was not present at the meeting but the Recorder reported that he had been in the office following the last meeting of the Council and had stated that his Attorney had advised him to accept an adjustment rather than bring suit against the City. There was some discussion on the matter but no action was taken, however, the Council did indicate that if the County refunded taxes on this street, that they (the Council) would be willing to make adjustment.

Mr. Arthur Coleman made application to park a trailer-house in the street at 3845 Jefferson Street for a period of three or four weeks. It was moved by Wright and seconded by Shook that the Manager be authorized to issue a revokable permit to Mr. Coleman to park a trailer house at 3845 Jefferson Street, said permit to have a limit of time not to exceed thirty days duration. Motion carried and so ordered.
