

SPECIAL MEETING OF MARCH 3, 1941.

Aspecial meeting of the Council was held on the third day of March 1941.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Newman, Makin, Walden, Sperr and Kemmerer. Water Superintendant Bevington, Attorney Adams and Recorder Martin.

The meeting was called for the purpose of making a report of a meeting of the Clackamas County Housing Authority and the Milwaukie City Council, held in Oregon City on February twenty-eight, 1941.

Mr. Adams read a copy of a letter written by him to Mr. L. Post Regional Director of the Housing Authority, at San Francisco Calif. stating that the Council wished them to withhold further progress on the proposed Housing Project for Milwaukie, until the people of Milwaukie should decide by vote if or not they wished the Project to be placed within the boundries of Milwaukie. The Council approved Mr. Adams' letter.

The Mayor explained the Project as it had been explained to the former Council by a representative of the Clackamas County Housing Authority.

Mr. Rudder, a former member of the Council, spoke explaining his opinion of the Project.

Mrs. Lulu Tautfest introduced Miss Jessie M. Short, of Portland who spoke explaining the Project.

Mr. Earl Jones suggested that more information be gotten on the Project and that the matter be decided by a vote of the people.

Mr. Fritz Hager spoke opposing the Project.

Mrs. Annie Hughs spoke favorable to the Project.

Mr. Charles Walden reported the discussion of the Project, at the Meeting of the Clackamas County Housing Authority and the Milwaukie City Council, at Oregon City on February twenty-eight 1941

Mrs. Lena Keller spoke opposing the Project.

Mrs. May Stucky spoke opposing the Project.

Dr. J. B. Harrison spoke in answer to Miss Short.

Mrs. Maggie Johnson asked if the Charter of Milwaukie would permit the Project to be placed within the City limits.

Mr. Adams explained the regulations according to the Charter.

Mrs. Newman talked in answer to questions that had been discussed.

Mrs. Tautfest talked favorable to the Project.

Mr. DSpain spoke opposing the Project.

Mr. Kemmerer read a communication from Mr. Langdon Post, Regional Director of the United States Housing Authority.

Mr. Kemmerer read a communication from the Honorable Rufus Holman.

It was agreed by the Council to wait until the regular meeting of the Council, on the tenth day of March 1941, for the report from the Clackamas County Housing Authority, in answer to the request, made by the Council at the meeting in Oregon City on February twenty-eight, 1941, to make a decision on the matter.

On motion duly made and seconded the Council adjourned.
