Council Chambers

March 26, 1934.

A special meeting was held on the 26th day of March, 1934, pursuant to the call of Mayor Miller for the purpose of considering Ordinance No. 340 and such other matters as might demand the attention of the Council. Present: Mayor Miller, Councilmen, Dean, Dell, Shrock and Walsh, Recorder Adams and Marshal Keck.

Ordinance No. 340 entitled "An Ordinance defining the term 'Alcoholic liquor' and other terms used herein; declaring the possession, transportation, sale, disposal, use, purchase, or any other acquisition or disposition of alcoholic liquor as herein defined contrary to the laws of the State of Oregon or the United States of America or the duly promulgated rules and regulations of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission to be unlawful; declaring certain other acts and things relative to the purchase, possession and sale of alcoholic liquor to be unlawful; providing a penalty for the violation hereof; and repealing all ordinance and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith" was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. The roll call being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Dean, Dell, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance Number 340 passed the first reading. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Shrock that the rules be suspended and that Ordinance No. 340 be taken up for the second time and be read by title only. Carried and so ordered. Ordinance No. 340 was read the second time and the roll call thereon being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Dell, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: Dean. Ordinance No. 340 passed the second reading. It was moved by Dean and seconded by Shrock that further consideration of Ordinance No. 340 be postponed to the next regular meeting on April 9, 1934. Ayes: Dean, Shrock and Miller. Noes, Dell and Walsh. Carried and so ordered.

No further business coming before the meeting it was adjourned.
