TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE OREGON MARCH 28th, 1912.

Special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above date pursuant to a call of the Mayor. Present Mayor Streib, Councilmen Stockton, Lehman and Knight, Recorder Bolstad.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Streib. Whereupon he stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering Ordinances No. 68 and 69.

It was moved by Councilman Lehman Seconded by Councilman Stockton that Ordinance No. 68 be taken up for ^{first reading} ~~final passage~~. Carried.

Ordinance No. 68 being read, roll call showed the following results: Ayes Councilmen Stockton, Lehman and Knight, Nays None. The ordinance having passed the first reading, moved by Councilman Knight Seconded by Councilman Lehman that the ordinance be laid on the table until next meeting.

Next order of business being ordinance No 69. Moved by Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Lehman that Ordinance No. 69 be taken up for first reading. Carried. Next proposition was discussion of possibility of improvement of Foster Road.
