A special meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting Called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, councilmen, Harlow, Loeding, Counsell and Hopkins, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The application of C. C. Mullan for water superintendent was read and ordered placed on file.

A petition of property owners living in Quincy ~~XXXXXX~~ Addition complaining of the quality of water furnished them and requesting the Council to take some action to procure them pure water was read and referred to the Water Committee. The following bills were allowed and the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

- Smith and Porter, for material furnished for roller.. \$28.95
- Oregon City Machine Works and garage, repairs to Roller.. 1.50
- Oregon Engineering & Construction Co.60

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for 300 to 350 meters and other supplies necessary for connecting up with Bull Run water, said bids to be opened at 8:00 P. M. April 11th. 1916. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Treasurer was instructed to withhold the \$500 bonds from the Fisch Frother until the ~~xxxxxxx~~ until the possession of the property of the Milwaukie Water Company is delivered to the Town. Upon motion of councilman Hopkins seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Carver to remove his Engine and Wood yard off of Flmer Street between 32nd and 34th Streets and put the Street in ~~xxxxxxx~~ condition for travel. Upon motion duly made and carried, the price of the use of the roller per day was fixed at \$11.00, the Town to furnish the engineer. Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to request to P. R. L. & P Company to put on trailer on the ~~xxxx~~ 5:00 o'clock car leaving Portland for Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Mayor Pelton Stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of passing ordinance No. 137. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 137 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issue and prescribing the form of the \$25,000 Water bonds of the Town of Milwaukie and declaring an emergency", was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Harlow, Loeding, Counsell and Hopkins. Nays, none. Absent, councilman Grisle. Ordinance No. 137 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Harlow seconded by councilman Hopkins and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 137 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Harlow, Loeding, Counsell and Hopkins. Nays, none. Absent Grisle. Ordinance No. 137 passed the second reading.
