Ordinance No. ~~51~~ entitled An Ordinance to provide for the improvement of Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon, from the North boundary line of Milwaukie, Southerly to South side of Foster road, was taken up ~~for final passage~~ and upon motion and roll call was duly passed.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for improvements *on main Street.* in the Daily Abstract published in Portland Oregon.

In regard to the Front Street improvement the Mayor refered this to the Street Committee for further consideration.

Ordinance Number 50 *An Ordinance regulating Billiard and pool rooms.* was taken up read and on motion and roll call the vote resulted as follows: Knight, Kelso, Lehman, Stockton, Aye; Nays none so the Ordinance passed.

~~Proposed~~ Ordinance Number 50 was ~~read for first time~~ and upon motion ordered posted.

The Portland General Electric Co. asked that a certain sum of money be paid them to install certain lights.

On motion it was ordered that the lights be not installed until said Co. was willing to install the same according to their franchise and the matter was refered to the Street Committee.

A petition signed by the property owners along Main Street asking for better fire protection was read and referred to the Committee on personal property.

On motion it was ordered it was ordered that no payment be required of the Milwaukie Band for use of the Hall at the last entertainment, but that the band be required to pay the Marshal for his trouble in cleaning the Hall.

The matter of finding suitable places to post notices was referred to the Committee on personal property.

On motion the Council adjourned.
