

SPECIAL MEETING OF APRIL 7, 1952

The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon met in special session at the call of the Mayor, on April 7, 1952.

The meeting, which was called for the purpose of taking up the matter of water service in Twohy's Re-Plat of Keil Heights, was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck, and Attorney Kirkpatrick. Absent None.

Mr. Kronberg and Mr. Twohy contractor, came before the Council and requested permission to use the existing water main in Adams Street, Keil Heights. Mr. Twohy is contemplating building houses on the north side of Adams Street. The motion was seconded by Councilman Norbeck and put to a vote. The roll call vote was as follows: Taylor, yes; Mullan, no; Klein, no; Norbeck, yes; Sperr, yes. The motion carried and was so ordered.

A letter, from Mrs. Phyllis DeTienne, was read. The letter was in answer to a notice mailed her some time ago stating that if she paid or arranged to pay the assessment on her property for the improvement of 33rd, 34th, and 35th streets improvement, by April 1, 1952, the penalty of 10% would be excused. Mrs. DeTienne explained why she had been unable to take care of the matter by April 1, and requested that the privilege of paying by note with penalty excused be extended to her. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that Mrs. DeTienne's request be granted. Motion Carried and so ordered.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, upon motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

794th MEETING

The seven hundred ninety-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the fourteenth day of April, 1952.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck; Attorney Kirkpatrick, Treasurer Dillery and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the seven hundred ninety-third regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-fourth day of March, 1952 were approved as written.

The minutes of the special meeting of the Council, held on the seventh day of April, 1952, were approved as written.

It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Klein that the following resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 4 - 1952, FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 27th ST.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE TO CONSTRUCT CURBS AND SIDEWALKS ALONG BOTH SIDES OF 27th Street, BETWEEN WASHINGTON STREET AND LAKE ROAD, WHERE NONE NOW EXIST AND WHERE THEY DO EXIST BUT DO NOT CONFORM TO CITY STANDARDS, AS TO ALIGNMENT, GRADE OR QUALITY.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie deems it expedient and necessary to construct, repair and re lay all curbs and sidewalks, where none exist or where such as do exist do not conform to city standards as to alignment, grade or quality, along both sides of 27th Street, between the following termini:

Beginning at the intersection of 27th with the southerly line of Washington Street; running thence southerly to the northerly line of Lake Road.

AND WHEREAS, The Council of the City of Milwaukie has required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for the appropriate improvement to be made.

After considerable discussion, Councilman Taylor moved that taps be allowed on the existing mains in Adams St.
