

SPECIAL MEETING OF APRIL 6, 1964

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the sixth day of April, 1964, for the purpose of viewing plans for the new Library building.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr.

Those present were, Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr.; Councilman Walter Freeman, Charles Renard, and Rober Richmond, and City Manager Max Thompson. Those absent were: Councilman Theron Sedgwick, Attorney John O. Sheldahl, and Clerk Ellen Martin.

Architect Boyd Jossy presented to the Council the revised plans and contract for the remodeling of the Ledding house and new additions to the same to convert it to a Public Library, as recommended by the Library Committee and the Library Board.

After viewing the plans and the Contract, it was moved by Renard and seconded by Richmond that the Council approve the recommendation of the Library Committee and the Library Board and that the Contract be awarded to Milwaukie Construction Company, to build the Library for the sum of \$135,511.59. The motion carried and was so ordered.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

MEETING OF APRIL 13, 1964

COUNCIL CHAMBER

993rd MEETING

The nine hundred ninety-third regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the thirteenth day of April, 1964.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr.

The invocation was given by Reverend Herbert Reed, Church of Christ, 2816 Harrison Street, Milwaukie.

Those present were Mayor Joseph M. Bernard Jr.; Councilmen Walter J. Freeman, Charles Renard, Theron Sedgwick and Robert Richmond; City Manager Max Thompson, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred ninety-second regular meeting of the Council, held on the ninth day of March, 1964 and the minutes of a Special meeting of the Council, held on the sixth day of April, 1964, were approved as written.

Mrs. Florence Abbott, 9844 - 47th Street, laid before the Council "Petition for the improvement of Logus Road due to unsafe pedestrian traffic condition" Mrs. Abbott is President of the Seth Luelling School P.T.A. and explained that ninety-four school children walk along this road to and from school; that from 47th Street east, the road is only 30 feet wide. The petition was signed by eighty-one parents, but it was not determined how many lived within the city limits, and much of the property along the south side of the Road is not in the City. After considerable discussion it was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that Manager Thompson be authorized to have a preliminary layout plan for the widening of this street, made and that the Council discuss this matter with the property owners along this road. Motion carried and so ordered.
