

MEETING OF MARCH 24, 1947

673rd MEETING

The six-hundred seventy-third regular meeting of the council was held on the twenty-fourth day of March 1947.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Fred Sperr.

Present were: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen, Fred Roberts, Harold Nelson, Howard Hamlin, Attorney Mr. Kirkpatrick, Treasurer Jean S. Dillery, Chief Police Delp. Absent, Councilman Walter Prady, Recorder Ellen Martin, Water Superintendent W. Hofmann.

It was moved by Nelson, seconded by Roberts that the Mayor and the Recorder with the assistance of the City Attorney send a letter to The Public Utility Commission and The Southern Pacific for installing a wig-wag signal at Washington Street and Monroe Tillamook Line and also at Oak and Monroe Main line. This letter to be accompanied with petition submitted to the council. Motion carried, and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin seconded by Roberts that the Luthern Church be granted a building permit for church on lots 3 & 4, Block 1, Durst Addition, providing that the L extension to the east be kept 61 feet south of the north property line. Motion carried, and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson seconded by Roberts that the city buy one barrell of rust proof compound from the Texaco Oil Co. at the price of 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per pound, also enough aluminum to make a satisfactory job on the water tower. Motion carried, and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Roberts to authorize acting city manger Sperr and water superintendent to look for proper centrifugal pump for pumping water holes. Motion carried, and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Sperr that the following bills be paid.

Motion carried, and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin, and seconded by Nelson that our City Attorney be authorized to incorporate a sewage system in one project. Motion carried, and so ordered.

MEETING OF APRIL 14, 1947

674th MEETING

The six hundred seventy-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the fourteenth day of April 1947.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Roberts, and Frady; Attorney Kirkpatrick, Water Superintendent Hofmann, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the six hundred seventy-third regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-fourth day of March 1947 were read and approved as read.

Mr. C.O. Banks came before the Council and requested a permit to move a school bus body on to Lot 5, Block 2, Duerst's Addition. Mr. Banks stated that his purpose for moving the bus body was to use it as a shop and swelling. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Roberts that in as much as Mr. Bank's proposal would not conform to Ordinance 481, the permit be not granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

There was discussion about licensing dealers in certain commodities, whose places of business are not in Milwaukie, but who sell and deliver within Milwaukie. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Hamlin that the Manager and Attorney investigate and interpret a proper ruling as pertaining to business license in Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the action of acting Manager Sperr in purchasing a new car for the Police Department be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was decided that Attorney Kirkpatrick would contact Mr. Newman of Oregon City with regard to a radio for the Police car.

It was move by Frady and seconded by Roberts that the City purchase a centrifugal pump as authorized by acting Manager Sperr and Councilman Hamlin acting in conjunction for the purchase. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Roberts that a public hearing be held on the twenty-eighth day of April, at the regular meeting of the Council, with regard to the improvement and widening of 21st Street between Jackson and Jefferson Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.
