SPECIAL MEETING OF APRIL 10, 1940

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 10th day of April, 1940, for the purpose of considering Ordinance No. 399, providing for a special election to be held on May 17, 1940, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to amend the city charter by providing that the Council of Milwaukie may incur an indebtedness of not to exceed \$12,000 for the purpose of constructing a reservoir and making improvements to the water distribution system, and providing further that said indebtedness shall be paid from funds secured from the operation of the city water system, and providing further a designation of polling places, judges and clerks of election, and, further, for the purpose of considering Ordinance No. 400, providing for a special election to be held on May 17, 1940, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to amend the city charter by authorizing the issuance and sale of \$15,000 general obligation bonds, to provide funds with which to purchase materials, supplies, to provide insurance, to supply engineering and other services, and generally to furnish everything needed for the construction and maintenance of street roadways, and for the levy of a special tax to pay principal and interest on said bonds; and providing a designation of polling places, judges and clerks of election.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rudder and Rivers; Water Superintendent Bevington, and Recorder Adams.

Ordinance No. 399, entitled "An Ordinance providing for a special election to be held on the 17th day of May, 1940, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie, for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to amend the Charter of Milwaukie, filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 11, 1905, and to amend all Acts amending said Act by providing that the Council of Milwaukie may incur an indebtedness not to exceed \$12,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a reservoir and making improvements to the water distribution system; providing further that said indebtedness shall be paid from funds secured from the operation of the City Water System, and providing further a designation of the polling places, judges and clerks of election," was taken up for consideration and read for the first, second, and third times and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rudder and Rivers. Nos: None. Ordinance No. 399 passed the Council.

Ordinance No. 400, entitled "An Ordinance providing for a special election to be held on the 17th day of May, 1940, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to amend the Charter of Milwaukie filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 11, 1905, and to amend all acts amending said act by adding thereto Section 22-C authorizing the issuance and sale of Fifteen thousand, (\$15,000.00) general obligation bonds of said Milwaukie, to provide funds with which to purchase materials, supplies, to provide insurance, to supply engineering and other services and generally to furnish everything needed for the construction and maintenance of street roadways, and for the levy of a special tax to pay principal of and interest on said bonds, and providing a designation of polling places, judges and clerks of election," was taken up for consideration and read for the first, second and third times and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rivers and Rudder. Nos: None. Ordinance No. 400 passed the council.

MEETING OF APRIL 22, 1940

The five hundred eleventh regular meeting of the Council was held on the 22nd day of April, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts. Present. Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rivers and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Stanley and Recorder Adams.

A petition requesting annexation to the City of territory on the northeast corner of the city limits and signed by residents of such territory was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Mourer that the Recorder be directed to write the City of Portland relative to the arrest of Milwaukie residents for not complying with the City of Portland Motor Vehicle Inspection Law and request that the making of such arrests cease. Motion carried and so ordered.

Lloyd Cooley and C. D. Peters requested that the City immediately arrange for the acquisition of a rightaway for an extension of Sellwood Street from Thirtieth Street to Twenty-seventh Street. The Recorder was directed to arrange a meeting for the purpose of discussing the question with Mr. Deal, owner of part of the proposed rightaway, for April 25th at the City Hall.
