Present. Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Frady, and Roberts, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Recorder Martin, and Manager (appointed) Taber.

Attorney Kirkpatrick read two resolutions, presented by the State Highday Department for certain repairs and improvements to be made by them on the following streets in Milwaukie, Jefferson Street, 21st Street, and Lake Road.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Frady that the two resolutions, as read, be adopted, and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

MEETING OF APRIL 28, 1947

675th MEETING

The six hundred seventy-fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-eighth day of April 1947.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present. Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Roberts, and Frady, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Water Superintendent Hofmann, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the six hundred seventy-fourth regular meeting of the Council, held on the fourteenth day of April 1947, were read and approved as read.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council held on the eighteenth day of April 1947, were read and approved as read.

Attorney Kirkpatrick gave a report of the Engineer's estimated cost of improving 21st Street from Jefferson Street to Jackson Street, and stated that School District No. 1 and Mr. and Mrs. Herman Ledding, principal owners of the right of way to be acquired on the east side of the street, were willing to give the right of way in exchange for being excused from bearing any of the cost of the improvement. There were present at the meeting, a number of Milwaukie Business men, representatives from the Chamber of Commerce, School Board No. 1 and the owners of property along 21st Street affected by the improvement. The majority of those who spoke on the subject favored opening 21st Street through to Harrison, as this would be the only way to relieve congestion on Main Street, also the necessity of opening 23rd Street at the north, into Kellogg Park was brought up at this time.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Frady that the City request the Housing Authority of Clackamas County to request the Regional Authority in Seattle for right of way, 60 feet in width, extending from the northern terminus of 23rd Street, Streib's Addition, to A. Street in Kellogg Park. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was decided that the matter of the improvement of 21st Street be postponed until Manager Taber takes over and that Mayor Sperr, Manager Taber, Engineer Scott, and Auditor Phillips be a committee to investigate the cost of the improvement and the amount of funds the City has at this time to spend for this purpose.
