SPECIAL MEETING OF APRIL 20, 1964

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held, at the call of the Mayor, for the purpose of studying the Personnel Ordinance and viewing a report from the League of Oregon Cities on the matter of codifying the City Ordinances, on the twentieth day of April, 1964.

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 P.M. by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr.

Those present were: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard Jr.; Councilmen Walter Freeman, Charles Renard, Robert Richmond, and Theron Sedgwick; Manager Max Thompson and Attorney John O. Sheldahl. Absent: Clerk Ellen Martin.

The Council read and discussed the proposed personnel Ordinance.

At eight o'clock P.M. the Council viewed and reviewed with Mr. Dave Sari, from the League of Oregon Cities, the old ordinances which were no longer needed.

Ordinance Number 1016 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Renard that Ordinance Number 1016 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 1016 AN ORDINANCE to repeal Milwaukie General Ordinances was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Freeman, Renard, Sedgwick, Richmond and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 1016 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 1017 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance Number 1017 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Renard and seconded by Sedgwick that the Mayor be authorized to sign a contract with Stevens & Thompson, Consulting Engineers, to do professional engineering services to accomplish the water system study and prepare the necessary plans for the same. Motion carried and so ordered.
