SPECIAL MEETING OF MAY 29, 1950

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

A special meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-ninth day of May, 1950.

The meeting which was called for the purpose of opening bids for the grading of Harvester Drive, except the westerly 500 feet, and such other matters as were necessary to come before the Council at this time, was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Frady and Mullan; Attorney Kirkpatrick, Manager Taber, and Recorder Martin.

The bids were opened and showed the following results:

R.A. Heintz Construction Company	\$5,200.00
George Kirkpatrick	3,250.00

It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Frady that R.A. Heintz Construction Company's bid for the grading of approximately 800 feet of the easterly portion of Harvester Drive be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Frady that the following resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 8, 1950

WHEREAS, War Housing Project Number Oregon 35023, known as Kellogg Park, owned by the Federal Government and operated under a lease agreement by the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas, Oregon, is within the City limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon and said project is subject to the zoning ordinance thereof,

AND WHERE, at the time of annexation of the said Kellogg Park area within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, it was understood by the City Council of the City of Milwaukie that said project was classified as TEMPORARY,

AND WHEREAS, said City Council has never changed said classification; that said City Council now considers said project classified as TEMPORARY,

AND WHEREAS, the Housing Act of 1950 was signed by the President of the United States on the 20th of April 1950; it provided among other things that the City of Milwaukie was authorized to apply for the transfer of all the right, title and interest of the Federal Government in and to said Kellogg Park Project,

AND WHEREAS, the City Council of Milwaukie does not desire to exercise its right under the said Housing Act of 1950 and therefore requests that all the right, title and interest in and to said Kellogg Park Project be transferred to the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas, Oregon pursuant to the terms and conditions of the said Housing Act of 1950,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Milwaukee does hereby declare that Kellogg Park War Housing Project, Oregon Number 35023 has been since the date of annexation within the corporate limits of said City and now is classified as TEMPORARY,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Milwaukee does hereby decline to exercise its right to apply for the transfer of all right, title and interest in and to Kellogg Park War Housing Project Oregon 35023 to the City of Milwaukee, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Milwaukee does hereby request the Public Housing Administration, an agency of the Federal Government, to transfer all its right, title and interest in and to said Kellogg Park War Housing Project Oregon 35023 to the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas, pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Federal Housing Act of 1950.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary for the public health, safety and welfare that said transfer be completed as soon as possible, NOW THEREFORE an emergency is declared to exist and this resolution shall go into full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor. Motion carried and so ordered.

Councilman Frady requested that the letter of resignation, written by Manager Taber on September 10, 1949, be read at this time. Mayor Sperr stated that he did not approve bringing this matter of business before the Council unless a full membership of the Council was present. Councilman Frady repeated that he wanted the letter introduced and read at this meeting. The Recorder read the letter. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mullan that Mr. Taber's resignation be accepted. The motion was put before the Council and showed the following results: Ayes: Frady and Mullan. Nays: None. Mayor Sperr did not vote. Motion carried and so ordered.

MEETING OF JUNE 12, 1950

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

750th MEETING

The seven hundred fiftieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twelfth day of June, 1950.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Frady; Attorney Kirkpatrick, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Norbeck.

The minutes of the seven hundred forty-ninth regular meeting of the Council, held on the 22nd day of May, 1950, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting, held on the 29th day of May, 1950, were approved as read.

Attorney Kirkpatrick read the contract which had been prepared for the Rural Fire Protection District. It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Taylor that the Mayor be authorized to sign the contract when the rates for payments had been made to the satisfaction of both parties. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder announced that this was the time advertised for the opening of bids for the purchase of \$200,000.00 Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds.

The bids were opened and read substantially as follows:
