

Ordinance Number 365 entitled "An Ordinance amending Ordinance Number 163 relating to the storage of gasoline and other volatile oils, gunpowder, dynamite, giant powder, nitro-glycerine, and all other explosives was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. There being no objection Ordinance Number 365 was read for the second time by title only. Ordinance Number 365 was read for the third time and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills. Noes: None. Ordinance Number 365 passed the Council.

Mr. John Phillips spoke in behalf of a delegation which appeared in opposition to the construction of low cost houses in Brownell Acres. It appearing that the Council had no power to act in the matter no action was taken.

Mr. Cole appeared before the Council and stated that he had taken over a house on Wister Street which had a large outstanding water bill and asked permission to discharge the delinquency through the medium of monthly payments. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that the Recorder prepare a note for Mr. Cole to execute providing for monthly payments of \$1.00 each on the delinquency. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Shrock that the Recorder write the Portland General Electric Company requesting the relocation of the electric wire pole at the corner of Thirty-second and Harrison Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Shrock that Street Commissioner Bevington be authorized to proceed with the re-alignment of the intersection of Thirty-second and Harrison Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Wills that the recorder be authorized to sell Lots forty-one and forty-two Block sixty-nine, Minthorn Addition to L.H. Schneider for \$60.-cash.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder issue warrants covering the same.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MAY 18, 1936

A special meeting was held on the 18th day of May, 1936, at the call of Mayor Sanders and pursuant to the provisions of Section 10 of the Charter of Milwaukie, for the purpose of canvassing the returns of the special election held on the 15th day of May, 1936, at which what is known as the "Fire Equipment Bond Amendment", being an amendment to the Charter of Milwaukie, designated as "Section 22-B", and proposed by the Council, was submitted to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection and for taking up such other matters in

connection with said Bond issue as might demand attention.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills, and Recorder Adams.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that the Recorder prepare and post an Ordinance providing for the issuance, advertising and sale of the "Fire Equipment Bonds", the form thereof and the date thereof. Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills. Noes, none. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that J. M. DeVee be given the job of printing the "Fire Equipment Bonds", Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Dell that the Recorder advertise for bids for a Fire Truck, said proposals to be in accordance with specifications to be drawn up by the Fire Commission and said bids to be opened by the Council on June 8, 1936. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MAY 25, 1936

The four hundred twentieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 25th day of May, 1936.

The meeting was called to order by President of the Council Shrock.

Present: Councilmen: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh, and Wills; Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn Marshal Riley, and Recorder Adams.

The applications of R. C. Bagby for endorsement on his applications to the Oregon Liquor Commission for Retail Beer and Package Store Class "A" licenses for Crystal Lake Park were taken up for consideration. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Walsh that the Council favorably endorse the applications. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Recorder prepare and post an Ordinance amending Ordinance Number 362 so as to provide for a parking limit of two hours, between 8 A.M. and 5 P.M. on the following streets: Main and Front Streets between Washington and Jackson Streets; Jefferson, Monroe and Jackson Streets between Main and Front Streets.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that Street Commissioner Bevington properly barricade the north end of North Twenty Fourth Street and the West end of Washington Street. Motion carried and so ordered.
