

SPECIAL MEETING OF JUNE 1, 1964

The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, convened in special session at the City Hall in Milwaukie, Oregon, on the first day of June, 1964, commencing at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., Pacific Daylight Time, for the purpose of opening the bids for the sale of \$150,000.00 general obligation bonds, and such other business necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., Chairman of the Council.

The roll was called by Council Clerk Ellen Martin. Those present were: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., Councilmen Charles Renard and Robert E. Richmond.

Absent were: Councilmen Walter J. Freeman and Theron E. Sedgwick.

Also present at the meeting were; City Manager Max Thompson; City Attorney John O. Sheldahl, and Council Clerk Ellen Martin.

Clerk Ellen Martin then presented to the Chairman a written Consent to the special meeting signed by all of the members of the City Council. Chairman Bernard, Jr. ordered such written Consent so signed to be attached to and made a part of the minutes of this special meeting.

There being a quorum of the City Council present, and the hour of 8:00 o'clock p.m., having arrived, the City Council proceeded to open the sealed bids received by it pursuant to the advertisement of the proposed sale of the general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, in the sum of \$150,000.00.
