The special meeting of the City Council held on May 26, 1965 was called to order at 7:05 P.M. by Mayor George P. Haley, for the purpose of Appointment of Vacancy of Council position.

In attendance were: Mayor George P. Haley, Councilmen Donald Graf, Robert Richmond, Paul Slominski. Also present was City Attorney George VanBergen.

It was moved by Councilman Donald Graf and seconded by Councilman Paul Slominski that Edgar Fuller be appointed to fill the unexpired term of Walter Freeman. Question was called for by Councilman Richmond.
Ayes: Unanimous.

Discussed the Tax Base.

MEETING OF JUNE 10, 1965

A special meeting of the Milwaukie City Council was held on the tenth day of June, 1965 for the purpose of a public hearing on the proposed budget for the Fiscal Year 1965-1966, and such other business necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Haley.

Mr. Edgar Fuller, newly appointed to the Council to fill the unexpired term of Walter Freeman, was sworn in to the office by City Attorney VanBergen and took his place at the Council table.

Those present were: Mayor George P. Haley; Councilmen Fuller, Richmond and Slominski; City Manager Max Thompson; City Attorney George VanBergen.
Absent: Councilman Graf, Clerk Ellen Martin.

Ed Fuller, acting as Chairman pro tem of the Budget Committee, presented the revised budget to the Council for their approval.

Mayor Haley declared the public hearing on the proposed budget open and asked for comments from the floor.

Councilman Richmond submitted a letter from Joe Bernard, Jr. expressing his regret at being unable to attend this meeting and also voicing his views on the proposed budget. (See minutes of June 14, 1965 to include Mr. Bernard's objections).

Mr. C. Renard came before the Council and spoke against the large increase in salary proposed for the City Manager and against some of the additional personnel requested.

Another member of the audience suggested that the City Manager's salary be increased gradually over a period of time. He further felt that there was no need for the position of Administrative Assistant and recommended that more money be spent on City streets and improvements rather than spending such a large sum on the Library building.

June Routson requested that the Council reconsider the need for a landscape gardener, even on a part-time basis, and include the money for this service in the budget.

As there was no further discussion on the budget, the Mayor declared the public hearing closed at 8:20 PM..

After some discussion, Councilman Richmond moved that the \$10.00 across the board increase for all City employees be deleted from the budget. Motion died for lack of a second.

City Manager Thompson advised the Council that due to a recent increase in gas tax, the City would gain approximately \$12,600 for use in the Street
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
