TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 31ST. 1923.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 31st day of May, 1923. Meeting Called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Johnson, Kerr, Miller and McIntyre, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The Mayor stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering making a payment to H. W. Oliver on his contract for the improvement of Harrison Street, and for such other business that might come before the Council. The City Engineer stated that Mr. Oliver had excavated 2100 cubic yards of dirt on Harrison Street, and that the Town would be safe in paying him \$800.00 on the contract. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in the sum of \$800.00 on the East Harrison Street fund in favor of H. W. Oliver. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in the sum of \$2035.72 on Myrtle Street fund, in favor of W. H. Counsell, payment in full for the improvement of said street.

Upon motion of councilman Johnson seconded by councilman Miller and carried, it was ordered that East Harrison Street be gravelled to a width of 16 feet instead of 8 feet as provided in the plans and specifications for the improvement thereof, and that the cost of graveling the extra 8 feet thereof be paid out of the general fund.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to install a 2 inch water main on Harrison Street between 37th. Street and 42nd. Street for a distant of about 400 feet and connect the same with the 6 inch main at 40th. Street and with the 2 inch main at 42nd. Street. The application of Strong & MacNaughton for a permit to laid a 2 inch water main in 32nd. Street was granted upth the condition that the main be installed under the supervision of the City Engineer, and that all excavations made in the street be filled.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to have Clackamas County pave Harrison Street from the Carver railroad easterly to the S. P. Railroad track to a width of 16 feet, and also to pave Monroe Street from the west line of the S. P. Railroad track westerly to the west line of 21st. Street, to a width of 16 feet. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the Portland and Southern railroad Company to improve its road bed in 29th. Street, according to the plans and specifications for the improvement of 29th. Street, the same to be completed on or before the 15th day of July, 1923. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the improvement of 29th. Street, in the Daily Record-Abstract for a period of 5 days. said bids to be opened on the 12th day of June, 1923. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the Public Service Commission that the Portland Southern Railroad Co. was operating a car with defective brakes through Milwaukie for carrying passengers. No further business coming before the Council upon motion duly made and carried, the meeting adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 13TH. 1923.

The two hundred fifty-fifth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Riley, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The Mayor stated that he had seen the County Judge in regard to having Clackamas County repair the paving on Lake Road and Front Street and was referred to W. H. Counsell, who advised the Mayor that he would do the repairing as soon as the County started its plant. Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposals for the improvement of 29th. Street were opened and read, which proposals were as follows:

Peterson & Scott...	\$3092.10.

Moved by councilman Johnson that the contract for the improvement of 29th. Street be awarded to Peterson & Scott. No second to motion.

H. W. Cliver having submitted the lowest bid for the improvement of 29th. Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the contract for the improvement of 29th. Street, was awarded to H. W. Cliver, and the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to entered into a contract on behalf of the Town with Mr. Oliver for the improvement of 29th. Street, Mr. Oliver to furnish bond in amount of 75% of the contract
