Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance 717 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 718 was taken up and read. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Clay that Ordinance Number 718 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 718, AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure, without election, to annex certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 718 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

SPECIAL MEETING OF JUNE 3, 1958

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held, at the call of the Mayor, for the purpose of discussing ways and means of increasing the 1958-59 Budget and such other matters as were necessary to come before the Council at this time, on the third day of June, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick and Attorney Sheldahl. Absent: Clerk Martin.

After discussion on the matter of increasing the 1958-59 budget expenditures, Ordinance No. 719 was read. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that Ordinance No. 719 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 719, AN ORDINANCE providing for the calling of a special City Election in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 17th day of June, 1958, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the question of authorizing and directing the City Council of the said city to include in the budget and levy the sum of \$24,078.00 for the fiscal year 1958-1959 for general city purposes, which amount exceeds the constitutional six percent limitation on taxation set forth in Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon, and which amount is in addition to all other taxes levied.



MEETING OF JUNE 9, 1958

The nine hundred twenty-third regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the ninth day of June, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the third day of June, 1958, were approved as written.

Manager Burdick read a communication from Chief of Police Brittingham in which he (Brittingham) recommended that "NO LEFT TURN" signs be placed at the intersection of Scott Street and McLoughlin Blvd. stopping south bound traffic from turning into Scott Street and stopping south bound traffic from entering McLoughlin Blvd. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Roberts that this matter be referred to the Traffic Committee. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the Lake Road sewer extension and called for objections to the assessment for same. A protest from Janet M. Taylor, Richmond Va., owner of Tax Lot 4, Joseph Kellogg D.L.C. was read. A copy of Manager Burdick's answer to Mrs. Taylor was read. Manager Burdick stated that Mr. Taylor had contacted him (Burdick) and that he (Taylor) was contemplating a trip west and while here would make investigation of the possibilities of developing the property and that he (Burdick) felt confident that Mr. Taylor would be satisfied that the improvement had been beneficial to the property.

A remonstrance, objecting to the lineal feet assessed to his property, from Ralph C. Christiansen, was read. Manager Burdick stated that he would explain to Mr. Christiansen just how his assessment was made.
