The meeting, which was called for the purpose of viewing the re-plat of Milwaukie Industrial Park, was called to order by Mayor Mullan.



894th MEETING

The eight hundred ninety-fourth regular meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, was held on the eleventh day of June, 1956

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan,

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Perkins and Shook; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Klein.

The minutes of the eight hundred ninety-third regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-eighth day of May, 1956, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the second day of June, 1956, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the seventh day of June, 1956, were approved as written.

The matter of the improvement of 34th Street Quincy Addition, was again discussed. There were sixteen formal protests of the workmanship and costs, laid before the Council. The protests showed that the owners of property in the assessment district were requesting that uninterested parties be called to appraise the value of the work done and that the property be re-assessed on the basis of recommendation of these appraisers and that Cushing Brothers be charged with the difference in the price of assessment. The Council authorized Manager Burdick to proceed with the appraisal of the walks and curbs.

A petition, signed by seventy-two property owners along Rio Vista, Adams, Franklin and Jefferson Streets in Keil Heights, was laid before the Council. The petition requested that sewers be laid in the districts recently annexed to the city.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Clay that the following Resolutions be adopted.
