SPECIAL MEETING OF JUNE 16, 1958

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, for the purpose of a hearing on the annexation, without election, of properties in Homewood Park and Plimpton Tracts, was held on the sixteenth day of June, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan, Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick and Clerk Martin. Absent: Attorney Sheldahl.

Ordinance Number 722 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Roberts that Ordinance No. 722 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 722 AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of a sanitary sewer along Harrison Street, east of 42nd Street, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance No. 722 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A group of owners of property, in the Sanvitala Tract came before the Council and asked when and if curbs and sidewalks would be put in along 26th Street in said Tract. They referred to a petition requesting that these improvements be made sometime ago. Manager Burdick advised them that Sanvitala had not signed the petition and that inasmuch as he (Sanvitala) owned all of the land along one side of the street, the city was reluctant to put in curbs and walks unless the same were approved by Sanvitala as he would be obliged to pay one half the cost. Mr. Davis, acting as spokesman, stated that they would be satisfied with curbs only. The committee were requested to make a survey of the property owners and ascertain how many wished improvements made, also the extent of the improvements.

Mayor Mullan opened the hearing on the annexation of territories in Homewood Park and Plimpton Tracts and called for objection to the same. There was no citizen present who objected.

Ordinance Number 723 was read for its first reading. It was moved by Clay and seconded by Roberts that Ordinance No. 723 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance No. 723 AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN TERRITORIES CONTIGUOUS TO THE PRESENT BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AND FIXING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF SUCH ANNEXATION was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results, Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 723 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Manager Burdick laid before the Council, bids for furnishing the City an automobile for the Police Department. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Klein that the bids be referred to the Mayor and City Manager for their investigation.

A Contract lease for the use of water pipe lines of the Mutual Water Co. Inc. of Sellwood Gardens, for one year, for the sum of \$1.00 was laid before the Council. It was moved by Clay and seconded by Roberts that the Mayor be authorized to sign the contract lease. Motion carried and so ordered.

SPECIAL MEETING OF JUNE 18, 1958

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the eighteenth day of June, 1958, for the purpose of canvassing the votes of a Special Election held on the seventeenth day of June, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Mortensen, Clay, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick and Attorney Sheldahl. Absent: Clerk Martin.

The votes of a Special Election, held on the seventeenth day of June, 1958, on the following question:

TAX LEVY EXCEEDING CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION: "Shall the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, be authorized and directed to include in the budget and levy a tax on all taxable property in said City in the sum of \$24,078.00, for the fiscal year 1958-1959, for general city purposes, which sum exceeds the six percent limitation as set forth in Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon, which shall be in addition to all other taxes levied?"

were canvassed with the following result:

The Mayor proclaimed and declared that the Tax Levy Exceeding the Constitutional Limitation had been approved by the registered voters of Milwaukie, Oregon.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Mortensen that in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance Number 719, the Judge and Clerks of Election, for this Special Election, be paid \$14.00 each for services rendered. Motion carried and so ordered.
