SPECIAL MEETING JUNE 5, 1961

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukee, was held, at the call of the Mayor on the fifth day of June, 1961, for the purpose of awarding the contract for the Ardenwald Area "D" sewers and lift station and such other business necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Earl M. Clay.

Present: Mayor Earl M. Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Charles Renard, E. H. Aebi and Theron Sedgwick; Manager Leonard Mullan, Attorney John O. Sheldahl.

Manager Mullan stated that he and the Engineers had viewed the bids submitted for the construction of sewers in Masonmead and Derry Acres, (Ardenwald Area "D") also the pressure line and lift station, and gave his report on their findings.

It was moved by Howard and seconded by Renard that the contract for the construction of the sanitary sewers in Ardenwald Area "D" be awarded to James G. Robertson and that the contract for the Pressure line and Lift Station be awarded to C. M. Corkum Company, Inc. Motion carried and so ordered.

The question of salaries in the Fire and Police Departments was discussed. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Sedgwick that the salaries in the Fire Department be increased by \$50.00 per month per employee. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that the salaries in the Police Department be increased by \$50.00 per month, per employee and that the present force of nine employees be retained. Motion carried and so ordered.
