

SPECIAL MEETING MAY 21, 1962

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukiewas held on the 21st day of May, 1962, for the purpose of the extended hearing on the Leone Acres Sewers and for such other business necessary to come before the council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay.

The Council members present were: Mayor Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Theron Sedgwick, Charles Renard; City Manager Leonard Mullan and Attorney John Sheldahl. Absent: Councilman Ernest Aebi and Clerk Ellen Martin.

Engineer Marvin Runyon presented the Plans and Specifications for the Water Tank to be built at 40th and Harvey Streets. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Renard that the plans be accepted and that the City Manager be authorized to call for bids to be opened at a special meeting of the Council Thrusday, June 14, 1962 at 8:00 o'clock P.M. Pacific Daylight Time. Motion carried and so ordered.

At 8:15 P.M. the Mayor opened the extended hearing on sewers in Leone Acres, and stated that the objections to the original plan had been considered and that the Council had decided to install sanitary sewers in 47th Street and Logus Road only.

Mr. Dick Mills who lives on Harvey Street, stated that there were four property owners present who owned property along Harvey Street and that they and one other property owner wished to have the sewer in Harvey Street. Mr. Mills stated that there were only eight pieces of property facing this short street. After discussion on the question, and approval of the property owners present, it was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that the sanitary sewer be extended to include Harvey Street. Motion carried and so ordered.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING OF JUNE 5, 1962

A special meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held, at the call of the Mayor, on the fifth day of June, 1962, for the purpose of canvassing the votes of a Special City Election, held on the fourth day of June, 1962.

The meeting was called to order at the hour of eleven thirty o'clock A.M. by Mayor Earl M. Clay.

The Roll call showed those present were Mayor Earl M. Clay; Councilmen James M. Howard and Charles Renard; City Manager Leonard B. Mullan and Clerk Ellen Martin. Absent: Councilmen Theron Sedgwick and E.H. Aebi, and Attorney John O. Sheldahl.

The Mayor delcared a quorum present.

It was moved by Councilman James Howard and seconded by Councilman Charles Renard that the Council proceed to canvass the votes of the Special City Election, held in the city on June 4, 1962, at which there was submitted to the legal voters of Milwaukie the following proposition.

TAX LEVY EXCEEDING CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION:
"Shall the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, be authorized and directed to include in the budget and levy a tax on all taxable property in said City in the sum of \$187,733.41, for the fiscal year 1962-1963, for general city purposes, which sum exceeds the six per cent limitation on taxation as set forth in Section II, Article XI of the Constitution of Oregon, and which shall be in addition to all other taxes levied?"

On being put to a vote the motion carried unanimously.
