

MEETING OF JUNE 22, 1942.

Ordinance Number 427 AN ORDINANCE providing for the vacation of that portion of Llewellyn street which lies between the west boundry of 23rd street of Streib's First Addition to the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon and the west boundry of Streib's First Addition, was taken up and read. Ordinance Number 427 was read the second and third times by title only with the consent of the Council, and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Newman, Makin, Walden, Sperr. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 427 passed the Council.

Ordinance Number 428 AN ORDINANCE providing a tax levy on all taxable property within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for City purposes for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1942 and ending June 30, 1943, was taken up and read. Ordinance Number 428 was read the second and third times by title only, with the consent of the Council, and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Newman, Makin, Walden, Sperr. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 428 passed the Council.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Newman that the Recorder be authorized to make transfers in the General fund and Fire fund in the budget as prepared by the Recorder and chairman of the Finance committee. Motion carried and so Ordered.

A communication from Captain Wm. B. Adams U.S. Army, in which he stated that Army regulations prohibited him from holding a public office, was read.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Walden that the Council grant to Captain Adams a leave of absence as long as he is in active duty in the army. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Walden that the Treasurer's salary be \$125.00 per month from July 1, 1942 to December 31, 1942. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Makin that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrents for the payment of same.

Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Walden that Mr. Wm. Hofmann be appointed Street Superintendent, under the supervision of the Street Commissioner, to serve at any time the Street Commissioner deems it advisable to use his services on the City streets and if at any time the Street Commissioner wishes to lend Mr. Hofmann's services to the Water department, he shall have that privilage. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Makin that Foster W. Jenks be employed to care for the City Hall grounds for ten months. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Sperr reported that the property owners along 37th street between King and Harvey streets were now ready to grade and gravel 37th street, and was authorized to proceed with the necessary arrangements for establishing the grade only.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned until Monday, June 29, 1942.

COUNCIL CHAMBER

ADJOURNED MEETING

An adjourned meeting of the five hundred sixtieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-ninth day of June 1942.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Makin, Walden, Sperr and Kemmerer; Water Superintendent Bevington, Street Superin-

tendant Hofmann, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon, Officer Burbank, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Newman and Treasurer Farrington.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Makin that Street Commissioner Sperr be authorized to purchase Road oil in the amount of \$190.00 from Clackamas County, Motion carried and so ordered.

It was agreed that Mr. Hofmann be authorized to purchase gravel for use on the streets and for a "stock pile" in an amount not to exceed \$6.50 from Schuld Bros.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Kemmerer that Mr. Walden be authorized to purchase street signs as follows:

27 "Two Hour parking" signs @ \$1.50 each  
4 "One Hour parking" signs @ \$1.50 each  
6 "Slow" signs @ \$2.95 each

Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Albert Combs explained to the Council, War Damage Insurance and the rates on same.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Kemmerer that the City property be covered with War Damage Insurance as follows:

City Hall and contents \$30,000.00 insurance at a cost of \$27.00

Two Pump houses and contents, and water storage stand-pipe, \$12,000.00 insurance at a cost of \$21.60, this insurance to be purchased through Mr. Albert Combs, agent, and that the Recorder be authorized to sign for same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Walden that \$500.00 from the "Sewer Improvement Fund" and \$1,000.00 from the "Street Improvement Fund" be deposited in the "Sinking Fund" of the Water Department for the sole purpose of being used for Addition and Betterment work from time to time as authorized by the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor read a letter sent by him to Senator McNary, with regard to housing prospects in the event a ship building project was placed in Milwaukie. The Mayor also read a letter from Senator McNary stating that he would cooperate in any way he could.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Kemmerer that the City furnish gasoline not to exceed 100 gallons per month to Officer Burbank. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Sperr that the Fire Chief be authorized to purchase gasoline for the fire truck from the City. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Sperr that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
