

Whereupon the Council did proceed to count, canvass and return the votes cast at said election for the Charter Amendment entitled and numbered as above set forth and did find the results to be as follows:

SPECIAL MEETING OF JULY 1, 1965

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held at the call of the Mayor, for the purpose of hearing from the registered voters of the City, their objections to the City Budget for 1965-1966 as voted upon on June 28, 1965.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor George P. Haley.

Present were Mayor George P. Haley; Councilmen Don Graf, Robert Richmond, and Edgar Fuller; City Manager Max Thompson, City Attorney George VanBergen, City Engineer Wayne Daigle and Clerk Ellen Martin. Absent: Councilman Paul Slominski.

Mayor Haley opened the hearing on the 1965-1966 Budget and called for the Citizens to be heard on the question, "Why had the Budget not been approved by the voters at the special election on June 28, 1965?"

Mr. Charles Renard compared the 1965-1966 Budget with the 1963-1964 Budget and stated that he felt that there was too much difference in the salaries.

Mr. Ralph Rowland, 8730-29th Street stated that the public services in Milwaukie were inadequate and objected to the raises in salaries.  
Mr. Wm. Hupp stated that citizens had shown by their vote that they were sick and tired of taxes; that they rebelled against higher taxes and that they would do it again.

Mr. Maddox, 1815 -29th Street, "The public is saturated with taxes, wer are not getting our money's worth!"

Mr. Bob Ewald, "No matter how the Budget is reduced, I will vote No. We need public servants but we do not need such high pay".

Others who talked, voicing similar objections were Mr. Clifford, 38th & Filbert Sts., Charles Cuculich, 4334 King Street; Bill Hammond, Roswell Street; Bill Herzog. Mr. Herzog's remarks were not so much against the Budget as questioning the wisdom of the purchase of the Peter Pirsch Fire apparatus.

Mr. Kenneth Levstone discussed the budget and spoke in defense of the salaries.

The Mayor delcared the hearing closed.

Following a short recess the Mayor declared the hearing open for reconsidering the budget. Councilman Fuller stated that he had been studying the budget and suggested the following items for reconsideration.

1. Salary increases above the recommendation of the Civil Service Commission
2. Fire Department - hiring of an Inspector
3. Hiring an Assistant City Manager.
4. Fire Department Air Compressor.
5. Construction Inspector
6. Music room at the Library.

It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Fuller that the \$10.00 raises in salaries across the board, be deleted from the budget. The motion carried over one dissenting vote by Mayor Haley.

It was moved by Fuller that the salaries of the City Manager, City Attorney and Municipal Judge be reduced to the amount recommended by the City Manager in his original proposal. The motion died for want of a second.

It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Fuller that the City Manager salary be \$10,700.00 per annum. The motion carried over one dissenting vote by Mayor Haley.

It was moved by Graf and seconded by Richmond that the Council instruct Manager Thompson to contact the Fire Chief and ascertain if item 31, page 7 under operational supplies, includes a sum for their previous arrangements of training filled air bottles, and if so, that this item be deleted. The motion carried over one dissenting vote by Mayor Haley.

There was discussion on the "Construction Inspector", page 11, Engineer Daigle was consulted on this matter. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Graf that the Construction Inspector be retained. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Fuller that item 11 under Sewer Service be reduced by \$3,000.00. The motion died for want of a second.

There was considerable discussion regarding line 31, page 14, under Library. (Music Room). It was moved by Graf and seconded by Fuller that this item be reduced to \$ 1000.00. The motion carried over one dissenting vote by Mayor Haley.

It was moved by Fuller and seconded by Richmond that the radio for the new Street Department truck, listed on page 23, be deleted. The motion carried over one dissenting vote by Mayor Haley.

It was moved by Graf and seconded by Richmond that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 21-1965

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE CALLING OF A SPECIAL CITY ELECTION IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, ON THE 19th DAY OF JULY, 1965, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, THE QUESTION OF AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY COUNCIL OF SAID CITY TO INCLUDE IN THE BUDGET AND LEVY THE SUM OF \$353,140.40 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1965-1966 FOR THE GENERAL CITY PURPOSES, WHICH AMOUNT EXCEEDS THE CONSTITUTIONAL SIX PER-CENT LIMITATION ON TAXATION SET FORTH IN SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI OF THE CONSTITUTION OF OREGON AND WHICH AMOUNT IS IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER TAXES LEVIED.

WHEREAS, the City Council and the duly constituted Budget Committee of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has determined that it is necessary and advisable that there be included in the budget and levy for the fiscal year 1965-1966 for general City purposes the sum of \$353,140.40; and which amount exceeds the constitutional six-per-cent limitation on taxation set forth in Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon, and

WHEREAS, before said amount so exceeding said constitutional limitation can be included in the budget and levy, it is necessary to submit the matter to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the purpose of seeking their authorization and approval; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that there shall be submitted in the manner prescribed in this Resolution to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, at a special election to be held on the 19th day of July, 1965, for their approval or rejection, the following proposition:

"Shall the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, be authorized and directed to include in the budget and levy a tax on all taxable property in the said City in the sum of \$353,140.40 for the fiscal year 1965-1966 for general City purposes which sum exceeds the six per cent limitation on taxation as set forth in Section 11 of Article XI of the Constitution of Oregon, and which sum shall be in addition to all other taxes levied?"

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the election precincts for said special City election shall be and constitute all of the territory included within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and that there shall be Three polling places for said Special City election, namely

SPECIAL PRECINCT NUMBER ONE, CITY HALL, 926 Main Street (Includes County Precincts 201, 202, 203, 204, 206, 207, 213, 214, 217, 220, 222, 224, 226)

SPECIAL PRECINCT NUMBER TWO, ARDENWALD GRADE SCHOOL (Includes County Precincts 205, 208, 209, 210, 211, 212, 215, 218, 219, 223)

SPECIAL PRECINCT NUMBER THREE, ROWE JR. HIGH SCHOOL (County Precincts 216, 221, 225)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following named persons, all legal voters of Milwaukie, Oregon, be and they are hereby designated and appointed as the Chairmen and Clerks of election, to act as the election Boards at such polling places on said date as follows, to-wit:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, is hereby ordered and empowered to make all other arrangements and to secure the necessary supplies for said Special Election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is not practicable to submit the foregoing proposition in the form and by ballot title required by subsection (1) of Section 20 of Article V of Ordinance No. 735 of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and that, in order to truly and impartially state the purpose and effect of the proposition in question, the proposition should be submitted to the voters in the following form and ballot title, to-wit:

"AUTHORIZING CITY COUNCIL TO ADOPT BUDGET AND LEVY TAXES IN EXCESS OF CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION.

"Shall the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, be authorized and directed to include in the budget and levy a tax on all taxable property in said City in the sum of \$353,140.40 for the fiscal year 1965-1966, for general City purposes, which sum exceeds the six per-cent limitation on taxation as set forth in Section 11 of Article XI of the Constitution of Oregon, and which sum shall be in addition to all other taxes levied?"

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Recorder be and he hereby is directed to give at least ten (10) days' notice of the special election hereby called by posting notices thereof in three (3) public places within the boundaries of each voting precinct as established by this Resolution, within the boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and by publishing said notice once in the official City newspaper in the following form:

"NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

On the 19th day of July, 1965, in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon from 8:00 o'clock A.M. until 8:00 o'clock P.M. Pacific Daylight Time, a special election will be held at which the following proposition will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for their approval or rejection:

"Proposed by the City Council and referred to the legal voters of said City:

AUTHORIZING CITY COUNCIL TO ADOPT BUDGET AND LEVY TAXES IN EXCESS OF CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION.

"Shall the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, be authorized and directed to include in the budget and levy a tax on all of the taxable property in said City in the sum of \$353,140.40 for the fiscal year 1965-1966, for general City purposes which sum exceeds the six per=cent limitation on taxation as set forth in Section 11 of Article XI of the Constitution of Oregon, and which sum shall be in addition to all other taxes levied?"


