

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the County Court that the Town of Milwaukie had \$2000.00 to spend for paving streets, including the moving of paving apparatus, and desired to County to do the paving, which paving and moving apparatus shall not exceed the sum of \$2000.00.

Miss Campbell of the Portland Open Air sanatorium was present and asked the Council to reduce the water rates for water used by the Sanatorium. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rate for ~~water~~ all water used by the Sanatorium over 3000 cubic feet was reduced to 15 cents per 100 cubic feet. Mr Ringler and his attorney George C. Frownell was present and requested the council to give them another hearing in the matter of granting a license to run the Riverside dance Hall. Moved by councilman Miller and seconded by councilman Shindler that Mr. Ringler be given another hearing. Motion lost.

Ordinance No. 160 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Grastle, Miller, Bates and Seavey. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 160 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 160 taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Grastle, Miller, Bates and Seavey. Nay, none. Ordinance No. 160 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 160 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The Roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Grastle, Miller, Bates and Seavey. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 160 passed the third and final reading.

A petition from some of the residents in the northeast section of the Town requesting the Council to install water pipes in order that they could secure bull run water was read and the matter referred to the Water Committee.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

Town Hall Milwaukie, Oregon. August 15th. 1918.

A special meeting of the Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Shindler, Grastle, Miller, Bates and Seavey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The Mayor Stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of hearing the report of the Water Committee in regard to installing water pipes in the northeast section of the Town. Councilman Shindler, chairman of the Water Committee, reported that it would take 1125 feet of pipe to be installed in order to furnish the people in the northeast part of the Town with water, and that the pipe would cost approximately \$265.00.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Committee was instructed to purchase the necessary water pipe. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to purchase sufficient 2 inches lumber, cedar if it can be secured, if not fir, to make all the meter boxes needed.

Moved by councilman Miller and seconded by councilman Grastle that the Town of Milwaukie purchase from the Minthorn Springs Water Company water pipe that is already laid and that the Town can use not to exceed 1500 feet., and pay the Minthorn Springs Water Company the market price therefor. The Water Committee was instructed to measure up the water pipe which the Town desires to purchase from the Minthorn Springs Water Company. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
