SPECIAL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 21, 1964

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held for the purpose of a discussion with representatives of the Milwaukie Convalescent Hospital, regarding the sanitary sewer in Railroad Avenue, on the twenty-first day of September, 1964.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard.

Present: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard; Councilmen Walter Freeman, Theron Sedgwick and Robert Richmond; City Manager Max Thompson; Attorney John O. Sheldahl; Engineer Wayne Daigle and Clerk Ellen Martin. Absent: Councilman Charles Renard.

Mr. Thomas Haley, from the Milwaukie Convalescent Hospital and his Attorney, Mr. Wm. Keller, came before the Council with regard to the sanitary sewer installed by them, in Railroad Avenue, from Stanley Avenue westerly to 46th Street. Mr. Haley reviewed his understanding of the conditions under which the sewer was installed as follows:

1. That it was their opinion that Mr. Fred Weber, plattor and builder of Cedar Crest, and Mr. D. Allred, plattor and builder of Windemere, would share in the use of the sewer and share in the cost of installation of the gravity flow portion of same, from a point near Home Avenue westerly to about 46th Street.
2. That the City of Milwaukie had requested that the gravity flow portion of the sewer, from a point near Home Avenue, westerly to 46th Street, be enlarged from eight inches to ten inches at the City's expense, in order that the City could use this portion of the sewer as a trunk line.

It was shown that a survey had been made for the sewer installations, west of Stanley Ave., and that prior to the ground breaking a water main had been laid where the sewer had been planned and therefore the location of the sewer had to be changed, adding to the cost of the installation. Neither Mr. Weber nor Mr. Allred were pressed

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for time. The hospital was nearing completion, therefore they (hospital) installed the sewer and it was approved by the City. Mr. Haley reported that as yet the City has not paid their share for the extra sized pipe, that Mr. Weber laid the sewer from Cedar Crest and emptied the same into the gravity flow line sewer laid by them (hospital), that Allred had connected to the same from Windemere Addition and that to date no one had paid them (hospital) and asked what could be done. Attorney Sheldahl referred Mr. Haley to Mr. Weber's Attorney. Mayor Bernard suggested that all information available be gathered and brought before the Council on Monday, September 28, at 7:30 p. m., and called a special meeting for that time for a hearing on this matter.

Mr. Marvin Runyan, Mr. Carl Reinke, Mr. Jim Blazier and Mr. Gilbert Meigs, from Stevens & Thompson, Consulting Engineers came before the Council and presented twenty-five copies of their Engineering Report of the Water System Study prepared for the City under a planning loan from the Housing and Home Finance Agency of the U. S. Government under H. H. F. A. Project No. P-ORE-3184. The report included preliminary plans and cost estimates for both improvement and future expansion of the Milwaukie Water System. Mr. Blazier explained the legends as outlined on the maps. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that the following Resolution be adopted:

RESOLUTION 21 -1964

APPROVING THE COMPLETED PLANNING DOCUMENTS PREPARED WITH AN ADVANCE FROM THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA UNDER THE TERMS OF PUBLIC LAW 560, 83rd CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES, AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS, City of Milwaukie accepted an offer from the United States Government for an advance for preparation of planning documents pertaining to a public work described as *Study of Water System to determine present and future needs for distribution, storage, and supply*; and

WHEREAS, Stevens & Thompson, Inc. was engaged to prepare the planning documents for the aforesaid public work, and said architect and/or engineer has completed documents and submitted them for approval; and

WHEREAS, the completed planning documents have been carefully studied and are considered to comprise adequate planning of the public work essential to the community and within the financial ability of the City of Milwaukie to construct;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by City Council, the governing body of said applicant, that the planning documents submitted by Stevens & Thompson, Inc. as the basis for detailed planning of the Water System, dated September 14, 1964, and the statements in Form CFA-430, Request for Review and Approval of Planning Documents, in connection with Housing and Home Finance Agency Project No. P-Ore-3184, be and the same are hereby approved; and that certified copies of this resolution be filed with the Housing and Home Finance Agency.

Ordinance Number ¹⁰³⁸~~1033~~, AN ORDINANCE providing for the rezoning of certain property in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, from Zone 3-R-1 to Zone 3-R-2 Special, amending Ordinance No. 481, as amended, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and failed to pass the Council, the called vote being as follows:

Mayor Bernard did not vote

Councilman Renard was not present.

A letter from John J. Jennings, (Kronberg Bros. Real Estate) requesting that the Council approve the relocation of Oregon Liquor Agency Store No. 94, to a building soon to be built on Block 40, Milwaukie, was read. The Council agreed that there was no objection to the relocating the Liquor store.

SPECIAL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 28, 1964

A special meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, was held for the purpose of further discussion on the matter of the Sanitary sewer in Railroad Avenue, west of Stanley Avenue, and such other business as was necessary to be heard at this time, on the twenty-eighth day of September, 1964.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr.

Those present were: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr.; Councilmen Walter Freeman, Theron Sedgwick and Robert Richmond; City Manager Max Thompson; Attorney John O. Sheldahl; Fire Chief Robert Wicham and Clerk Ellen Martin.

Absent: Councilman Charles Renard and Engineer Wayne Daigle.

Mr. Wm. Keller, Attorney for Mr. Thomas Haley, representing Milwaukie Convalescent Hospital, cited a case in which it was decided that one who installs a private sewer could hold the same as his own. Mr. Keller stated that if this sewer belonged to the City, "How did it become City owned without a transfer by title or sale from the Hospital?" and requested that the Council agree that the sewer belongs to the Hospital and that they (Hospital) could then proceed to "kill their own snakes".
