

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, SEPTEMBER 12, 1911.

The (114) regular meeting of the City Council of Milwaukie was called to order at 8 P.M. by Recorder W. A. Hanson, Mayor Streib being absent. Roll called the following officers were present: Councilmen Kelso, Stockton, Lehman and Knight.

Minutes of (113) regular meeting laid over to next meeting for approval.

Moved by Councilman Knight and seconded by Councilman Lehman that the Recorder be instructed to draw warrants in favor of the respective party in the amounts named above, excepting corrections made on Hart, Wetzler and C. Davis' Bills for June as noted thereon.

Remarks were made by Councilman Kelso regarding Milwaukie's interest in a fund of \$36000.00 set aside for road purposes by Clackamas County, and called the attention of the Council to same.

On motion by Councilman Knight seconded and carried the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the improvement of Milwaukie & Sandy Road.

Moved and seconded that the Coast Const. Company be notified by the Recorder that the penalty of \$5.00 per day will be enforced after the expiration of the 90 day limit of contract. Carried.

Ordinance No. 60. Entitled An Ordinance to provide for the improvement of Sandy & Milwaukie Road, Milwaukie, Oregon was taken up for final passage and upon motion and roll call it resulted in the following: Ays Councilmen Kelso, Lehman, Stockton and Knight, Nays None so the Ordinance passed.

Moved and seconded that Contractor Counsell be instructed to build a plank roadway 16ft. wide of 3 inch plank in front of Block 2 of Streib's Addition, over the narrow fill on Harrison Street. Carried.

Councilman Stockton, chairman of the Water Committee reported that where there were 7 water users on a 700 foot main of the Johnson Water Company the same would be supplied, and that the Water Company was complying with its Charter.

On motion the meeting adjourned.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, SEPTEMBER 26, 1911.

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was called to order by Mayor Streib, for the purpose of opening bids for the improvement of Milwaukie & Sandy Road. Roll called showed the following officers present: Mayor Streib, Councilmen Kelso, Lehman, Stockton and Knight, and Recorder Hanson.

There being only one bid in, that of W.H.Counsell for \$1177.86, it was moved by Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Kelso that the bid of W. H. Counsell be accepted and the Mayor and Recorder enter into contract for same. Carried.

The Finance Committee turned the books of the Recorder over to Mr. A.L.Bolstad to audit and make a report on same at the next regular meeting. Carried.

On motion by Councilman Knight Seconded by Councilman Lehman the Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Sellwood and grant him a permit to lay a wall under his building on Washington Street, immediately, as it endangered the safety of the public.

The report of Engineer Campbell in reference to the Plank road in front of Streib's Addition was heard and upon motion the order of the last meeting for the planking 16ft wide was declared void. Carried. And 2x12x8 feet planks be used in place of 16ft. Carred. The cost to be about \$84.70.

Moved by Councilman Stockton seconded by Councilman Knight that the Recorder furnish a report of the Balance on hand at every regular meeting. Carried.

No further business it was moved and seconded that we adjourn.

The (115) regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was called to order by Mayor Streib. Roll called showed the following officers present Mayor Streib, Councilmen Stockton, Lehman, Kelso, Knight and Recorder Hanson. The minutes of the (114) regular meeting and the special meeting held on September 26th were read, also regular meeting (115) HELD Aug. 8. Moved seconded and carried same be approved. *and special meeting Aug 29, 1911 read.*

Estimate of Engineer Campbell on Harrison and Washington Streets was read and upon motion by Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Kelso that the estimates be accepted and placed on file, and warrants drawn for the various amounts on the street funds. Carried.

The report of the Town Engineer L. H. Campbell on Front Street grade and filling was read. On motion by Councilman Knight that the Recorder be instructed to write a letter to the Portland, Railway Light & Power Company a letter of acceptance of the work on Front Street as provided by their franchise, with the exception of the culvert on Kellogg Creek, which in all probability will be covered by a cement culvert of sufficient size to handle all the storm water and the same to be paid for by the abutting property owners on the said street. But the fill over said culvert to bring that part of street to grade to be done by the Portland Railway Light & Power Co. Motion carried.

A petition of C. A. Lakin et al for the improvement of Monroe Street from the west curb line of Front Street to the East line of Main Street was read and upon motion by Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Kelso that the petition be granted and the Town Engineer be instructed to draw plans and specifications for same. Carried.

Ordinance No. 67 Regulating of laying water mains on the streets of Milwaukie was read and laid on the table for further consideration.

Moved by Councilman Lehman that the Recorder be instructed to notify the Water Company to move their pipes out far enough from the curb line so as not to interfere with the curb on Oak Street, and that they put the street in good condition. Carried.

C. B. Davis, the Marshall, reported that the piano at the Town Hall needed tuning and he was instructed to notify Eilers Piano House to attend to same.

The Marshall was instructed to purchase two cords of wood.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried.
