

MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 23, 1940

The five hundred twenty-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the 23rd day of September, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts. Present Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rivers and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington, and Recorder Adams.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rivers that the Recorder be authorized to accept \$55.35 as payment from V. O. Caroland for destruction of city water fountain on Front Street. The motion carried and was so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rivers that Wistar Street be oiled between 32nd and 34th streets, and that 34th street be oiled from Wistar Street to Lake road. The motion carried and was so ordered.

G. A. Taylor asked if the city was ready to enter into a contract for the purchase of stove oil. He was advised that the matter would be taken up at a later meeting.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rivers that a lawn be put in on the city hall property. The motion carried and was so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Gillem that George Howie be employed to supervise putting in the lawn surrounding the city hall building. The motion carried and was so ordered.

Mayor Roberts read nine letters of application for the position of police officer. He stated that he had interviewed all applicants and that Philip George Jacob and M. W. Munson appeared to be the best qualified. It was moved by Rudder and seconded by Gillem that Philip George Jacob be employed to act as city police officer on a month-to-month basis, with a salary of \$125 per month, his employment to commence October 1 and to be terminable by the Council at any time, such termination to be effective on any monthly payment date. The motion carried and it was so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the meeting adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING OF OCTOBER 4, 1940

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 4th day of October, 1940, for the purpose of fixing and determining city salaries for the year 1940, and for such other business as might come before the Council.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts. Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rivers and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington, and Recorder Adams.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Gillem that the Recorder's salary for the Recorder's salary for the years 1941 and 1942 be set at \$720.00 per year. The motion carried and it was so ordered.

It was moved by Rivers and seconded by Kirkpatrick that the Treasurer's salary for the years 1941 and 1942 be set at \$900.00 per year.

The Mayor requested that the Recorder call the roll on the motion. The roll was called with the following result

being had: Ayes. Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Rivers, Nos. Mourer, Rudder.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Mourer that the Marshal's salary for the years 1941 and 1942 be set at \$24.00 per year. The motion carried and was so ordered.

J. F. Mourer was nominated by Rudder for President of the Council. The nomination was seconded by Gillem. J. F. Mourer was duly elected President of the Council.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the meeting adjourned.

MEETING OF OCTOBER 14, 1940

The five hundred twenty-second regular meeting of the Council was held on the 14th day of October, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by President of the Council Mourer. Present: Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer and Rudder, Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the five hundred twentieth and five hundred twenty-first regular meetings of the Council, held respectively on the 9th and 23rd days of September, 1940, were each read and were each approved as read. The minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 4th day of October, 1940, were read and approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed. The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Ordinance No. 404, entitled "An ordinance providing a tax levy on all taxable property within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for city purposes for the year One Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-one (1941)" was read for the first, second and third times, and put on its passage, with the following result being had. Ayes. Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Rudder, Nos: None. Ordinance No. 404 passed the Council.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Gillem that the following bills be approved, and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants covering payment of same.
