A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 11th day of October, 1934 pursuant to the call of Mayor Miller for the purpose of considering the budget proposed by the Budget Committee for the year 1935.

Present: Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh, Recorder Adams, Marshal Riley, Water Superintendent Bevington, and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

No tax payors were present to appear for or against the proposed budget.

Ordinance Number 347 entitled "An Ordinance providing a tax levy on all taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon for city purposes for the year One thousand nine hundred thirty five (1935)" was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. It was moved by Dean and Seconded by Shrock that the appropriation for the item emergency be increased from \$500.00 to \$510.00. Carried and so ordered. The roll call on the ordinance as amended being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes, None. No objection being made Ordinance Number 347 was taken up for the second time and read by title only. The roll call on the second reading being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes, None. Ordinance Number 347 passed the second reading. No objection being made Ordinance Number 347 was taken up for the third time and read by title only. The roll call on the third reading being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes, none. Ordinance Number 347 passed the third and final reading.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MILWAUKIE, OREGON OCTOBER 11, 1934

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 11th day of October, 1934 pursuant to the call of Mayor Miller for the purpose considering Ordinance Number 348.

Present: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh; Recorder Adams, Marshal Riley and Water Superintendent Bevington.

Ordinance Number 348 entitled "An Ordinance providing for a special election to be held on the 6th day of November, 1934, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their

acceptance or rejection three proposals to amend the Charter of Milwaukie filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 11, 1905, and to amend all acts amending said act by providing for the day and time of holding regular elections and providing the manner of nominating elective officers of said Milwaukie; by providing that the Council may employ persons and make purchases of materials and supplies to carry out the corporate powers of Milwaukie and exercise said powers of employment and purchases together with the power of purchasing and holding real estate, when sold for city taxes or for city improvements, by majority vote of the Council; by providing that emergency ordinances may be passed by the Council and reducing the time within which an ordinance must be posted before it may be passed by the Council from fifteen (15) to ten (10) days and providing that emergency ordinances become effective upon their passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor; and by providing that the Marshal shall be appointed by the Mayor, said appointment to be ratified by a three-fifths vote of the members of the Council; and providing further a designation of the polling places, judges and clerks of the election."
