MEETING OF NOVEMBER 13, 1950

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

760th MEETING

The seven hundred sixtieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the thirteenth day of November, 1950

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Taylor, Mullan and Norbeck; Water Superintendent Hofmann and Recorder Martin. Attorney Kirkpatrick came in after attending another meeting. Absent Councilman Frady.

The minutes of the seven hundred fifty-ninth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-third day of October 1950, were read and approved as read.

There were three applications for renewals of liquor licenses laid before the Council. The Council requested that Chief Delp appear and make recommendation for or against the granting of these recommendations. Chief Delp presented a written recommendation favorable to all three applicants. It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Norbeck that the Council approve the applications and make recommendations for same as follows:

Vic's Tavern, (C.V. Crispin) Package Store Class B. and  
Retail Malt Beverage Class A.

Mac's Pit, S.F. Owens Retail Malt Beverage Class A  
Main Street Cafe, Wm. Weigel and H. Suenisen, Qualified  
Restaurant Class B and Package Store Class A.

The motion as carried and so ordered.

Mr. Zenas Olson came before the Council and read a letter reporting the activities of the Central Committee for the Centennial and recommended that the \$300.00 returned to the City by the Committee, be used to put in a curbing around the peach tree and along the driveway at the back of the City Hall. It was decided that acting Manager Sperr would ascertain the cost of the curbing and report same at the next meeting.

The City Parks advisory committee came before the Council and made recommendation for some new plantings in the City Hall grounds and for some re-arranging of the present plantings. It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Sperr that the Committee's recommendations for moving the State of Oregon Rose and re-arranging other shrubs at the south side of the City Hall building
