## COUNCIL CHAMBERS

An adjourned meeting of the seven hundred thirty-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the sixteenth day of November, 1949.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Mortensen and Norbeck; Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilmen Taylor and Frady.

Major Casebeer and Colonel Richards of the Clackamas County Reserve Officers Corps, came before the Council with regard to using the fire proof room in the basement of the City Hall, for storing their supplies. It was agreed that after the water department supplies, now in the room, were moved to the new storage warehouse under construction at 40th and Harvey, the Reserve Officers Corps could use the fireproof room in the basement for storage of equipment and that if they so desired they could have space in the Council room for a filing cabinet.

Ordinance Number 535 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Norbeck that Ordinance Number 535 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. J.D. Kyle laid before the Council a petition signed by nine apartment owners in Milwaukie requesting that the Council recommend to the Governor of Oregon that Milwaukie be granted rent de-control. Mayor Sperr called for a special meeting to be held on Wednesday, December 20th, at 8:00 P.M. for the purpose of holding a hearing on the matter of rent de-control in Milwaukie. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Mortensen that a notice of public hearing be published in the Milwaukie Review. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Taylor that the Attorney be instructed to draw up an Ordinance pertaining to licensing pop-corn vending wagons occupying space on the streets. Motion carried and so ordered.
