COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, OCTOBER 21, 1936

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 21st day of October 1936, pursuant to the call of Mayor Sanders for the purpose of considering Ordinance Number 373.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Marshal Riley, Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Recorder Adams.

Ordinance Number 373 entitled " An Ordinance providing for a special election to be held on the 3rd day of November, 1936, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to repeal Section 85 of the Charter of Milwaukie, known as the Well Water Amendment, providing further a designation of the polling places, judges, and clerks of election and declaring an emergency." was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. Ordinance Number 373 was read for the second and third times and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Nays: none. Ordinance Number 373 passed the Council.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MILWAUKIE OREGON, OCTOBER 26, 1936

The four hundred thirtieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 26th day of October, 1936.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Recorder Adams.

Ordinance Number 374 entitled "An Ordinance amending Section 2 of Ordinance Number 140 by providing for reduction of rates on water effective November 1, 1936 and repealing Ordinance Number 368 and all other ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith." was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. Ordinance number 374 was read for the second and third times and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 374 passed the Council.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that Lots 14 and 15, Block 10, Quincy Addition be sold to Leo Fontana for the sum of \$185.00 with the understanding that the City would include such lots in its next quiet title proceedings if Mr. Fontana would pay the pro rata cost of quieting title to the property. Motion carried and so ordered.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, NOVEMBER 9, 1936

The four hundred thirty-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the 9th day of November, 1936.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Mills; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred twenty-ninth and the four hundred thirtieth regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 12th and 23th days of October, 1936 and of the special meeting held on the 4th day of November, 1936 were each read and were each approved as read.
