

MEETING OF OCTOBER 26, 1942

COUNCIL CHAMBER

568th COUNCIL

The five hundred sixty-eighth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-sixth day of October 1942.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Bevington, Sperr and Kemmerer. Attorney Adams, Treasurer Farrington, Water Superintendent Hofmann, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Officer Burbank and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Walden and Marshal Rigdon.

The minutes of the five hundred sixty-seventh regular meeting of the Council held on the twelfth day of October 1942 were read and approved as read.

The Mayor reported that Mr. Kemmerer had loaned the City an electric heater to be used at the Aircraft Observation Post for the duration of the war.

A letter was read from F.S. Zeidlhack, of the firm of John W. Cunningham and Associates, Consulting Engineers, in which it appeared that they had a slight misunderstanding regarding the survey they had made in the matter of a quick hook-up with Bull Run water.

It was moved by Kemmerer and seconded by Newman that the Recorder write to Mr. Zeidlhack acknowledging his letter and stating that the City stands ready to pay for any work done, and will pay upon submission of his report. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder reported that Mr. Theo Witt had requested that the City vacate a small corner of Penzance street north of Monroe street. The matter was discussed and tabled until the next regular meeting of the Council.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Kemmerer that the City purchase a coal bucket for use at the fire place in the basement. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
