Mayor Bernard then gave a short history of the incorporation of Milwaukie in 1903 and commended the City officers of the past and present as well as the wives of these officials who had been so helpful through the years. He then introduced the present Council

Mayor Bernard welcomed and introduced these guests as follows

Shindler, Mr Floyd Bennett, grandson of Gottlieb Keller, First Councilman, Mrs. Ellen Martin; daughter of first Chairman of the Council, Owen J Roberts, Messrs. Frank & Floyd McCann, sons of first Treasurer of Milwaukie Leonard B Mullan, former Mayor, former City Manager, former member of Planning Commission. Edward Norbeck, former Councilman; Elmer McClure, former Councilman Garland Taylor, former Councilman, Howard Hamlin, former Councilman R B Shook, former Councilman, Roy McIntyre, former Councilman Paul Baer, former Councilman and member of the City Planning Commission

Mayor Bernard then introduced City Manager Max Thompson and requested him to introduce the heads of departments and employees present.

Mayor Bernard again took charge and said some of the nicest things about Clerk Ellen Martin, which, of course, was all such a surprise it left her nearly in tears and the standing ovation from those present almost did the trick. These will never be forgotten and will always remain sweet in the memory of one who loves her "Home Town"

The minutes of the first meeting of the Council, held on the fifth day of June, 1903, were read. The minutes showed that the stout-hearted Council started with no tax base and no money, that the Council would soon tax the powder houses (DuPont) and grocery wagons coming here from Portland; and that the officers of the City, Mayor, Councilmen, Recorder, Treasurer and Marshall each contributed \$1.00 to start a treasury.

Refreshments and a visiting hour followed.

#### SPECIAL MEETING OF NOVEMBER 12, 1964

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held at the call of the Mayor, for the purpose of appointing a CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION in accordance with the Charter Amendment creating a new Chapter X, establishing Civil Service and Personnel departments, repealing existing and providing new employment procedures, reducing City Manager's powers of appointment; on the twelfth day of November, 1964.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor J M Bernard Jr.

Those present were Mayor Joseph M Bernard Jr, Councilmen Theron Sedgwick and Robert Richmond. Absent: Councilmen Walter Freeman, and Charles Renard; City Manager Mas Thompson, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The Council took up the matter of appointing a three member Civil Service Commission, who were appointed to serve as specified hereunder

SPECIAL MEETING OF NOVEMBER 23, 1964

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the twenty-third day of November, 1964, for the purpose of a hearing on the annexation of territories as described in Ordinance No. 1044 and such other business necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard Jr.

Present: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr.; Councilmen Walter Freeman, Charles Renard, Theron Sedgwick and Robert Richmond; City Manager Max Thompson; City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin. Also present were Mayor elect George Haley and Councilman Don Graf

Manager Thompson gave a report of the progress made on the Library, stating that all that remained to be done to the building was the installation of lights which was in progress at this time. Mr. Thompson's report showed that the amount now due the contractor was \$10,215.36. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that this bill be approved and paid. Motion carried and so ordered.

Applications for recommendations for liquor license renewals were laid before the Council as follows:

- Albertson's Inc. 3232 Harrison St. Package Store Class "B" PB

Manager Thompson reported that the Police Chief had no complaints against these applicants. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Freeman that the Council recommend that the licenses, as listed, above be renewed. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from Mrs. B. E. Coxley, was read. Mrs. Coxley stated that she had been paying sewage disposal maintenance fee although her property was not within 200 feet of a sewer. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that Mrs. Coxley be refunded in the amount erroneously collected. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Thompson read a report from Clackamas County Health Department, in which they explained the Uniform Housing Code, providing for the control of unsanitary and nuisance conditions in dwellings. Attorney Sheldahl was requested to draw an ordinance adopting the Uniform Housing Code.

It was moved by Renard and seconded by Freeman that the Council employ an Attorney other than Mr. Sheldahl, to defend the City in the pending Mayor election suit. A called vote showed the following result: Ayes: Renard. Nays: Freeman, Sedgwick and Richmond. The Mayor did not vote, The motion did not pass the Council.

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
