## MEETING OF DECEMBER 22, 1952

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

311th MEETING

The eight hundred eleventh regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-second day of December, 1952.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

The oath of office was administered to Mr. Larl Clay, heretofore appointed to the Council to fill the unexpired term of Leonard Mullan, resigned. Mr. Clay then took his place at the Council table.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Taylor, Clay and Norbeck; Manager Sperr and Attorney Kirkpatrick. Absent: Councilman Klein and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred tenth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eighth day of December, 1952 were approved as written.

Ordinance number 572 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that Ordinance Number 572 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 575 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Clay that Ordinance Number 575 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Taylor that the stand-by charge for water at the Western Door and Plywood Plant be adjusted to a basis of an eight-inch connection; as it was primarily served by a six-inch high pressure main; rather than the twelve-inch connection to the buildings; thus making the charge \$32.00 per month. This change to be retroactive to the time such service was initiated. Motion carried and so ordered.

X An application for recommendation for Package Store "Class B" license, for Winzler's Market, presented by Willis L. Smith, was considered. Accompanying the application was a statement from Police Chief Delp that he had no complaint against Winzler's market. It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Clay that the recommendation be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Bids for painting the interior of the City Hall were opened as follows:
