The Recorder reported that initiative petitions asking that a special election be called on the second day of January, 1934 for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of the Town of Milwaukie a Civic Works Bond Amendment to the charter had been filed and that the filed petitions had been checked by the registrar of voters and himself and had been found to contain sufficient legal signatures to require the Council to call an election.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dean that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance calling a special election for the purpose of submitting the proposed charter amendment to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection and that the following named places be designated as the polling places for the election and that the following named persons be designated and appointed as the Judges and Clerks of election:

A special meeting was held on the 5th day of December, 1933 pursuant to the call of Mayor Miller for the purpose of considering the procurement of a right of way for the Super-highway through Milwaukie. The meeting was a joint one with the Court of Clackamas County. Present: Mayor Miller; Councilmen, Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh; Marshal Keck and Recorder Adams; County Judge Vaughan and County Commissioner Borlan.

Harvey Starkweather gave a brief outline of the history of the project.

Considerable discussion was had which showed that neither the County of Clackamas nor the Town of Milwaukie was in a position where they could pay for the right of way of the Super-highway through Milwaukie.

Harvey Starkweather, Charles F. Dean and William B. Adams were appointed as a committee to see Leslie Scott Chairman of the Highway Commission relative to the right of way through Milwaukie, and the president of the Portland Traction Company relative to his company furnishing its own right of way through Milwaukie. It was stated by Councilman Dean that the Highway Commission would meet at the Multnomah Hotel Thursday and would consider the highway route through Milwaukie.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

December 11, 1933

The three hundred eightieth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 11th day of December, 1933 in the Council Chambers. Present: Mayor Miller; Councilmen, Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh, Marshal Keck and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the three hundred seventy-ninth regular meeting and of special meetings held on the 20th day of November, 1933, the 30th day of November 1933, and the 4th day of December, 1933 and 5th day of December, 1933 were each read and were each approved as read.

The matter of having the Portland Traction Company pay for the damage caused to the Water Main on Front Street by electrolises was discussed. Upon motion duly made and carried Water Commissioner Elliott was instructed to have a competent person examine the water pipe removed from Front Street in order to ascertain what damage had been caused by electrolisis.

Councilmen Dell and Walsh reported that Mrs. Anna Miller was ill and that he had not been able to see herein reference to the matter of her putting in a cement sidewalk abutting her property on Harrison Street.

The Mayor and Recorder reported that they had taken up the \$4,000 in water bonds due July 1, 1934 at a saving of \$128.48 and that they had taken up the Street bonds due in January and February 1934 at a saving of approximately \$80.00.

The Street Committee reported that it had negotiated with Harry Bassett in reference to the procurement of part of his property for right-of-way purposes relative to the extension of Monroe Street and recommended that he be deeded Lot 3, Block 3, Robert's Replat of J.R.W. Sellwood's Addition, in ex-
