SPECIAL MEETING OF DECEMBER 23, 1960

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the twenty-third day of December, 1960 for the purpose of a hearing on the question of the vacation of the south 40 feet of the west 100 feet of Park Street.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay.

Present: Mayor Earl Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Peter Mortensen, Ernest Aebi, Theron Sedgwick; City Manager Mullan and Clerk Martin.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the question of the vacation of the south forty feet of the west one hundred feet of Park Street, a dead end street adjoining the Hector Campbell School property on the east. Nase Construction Co. being owners

of the properties on the north and south of this roadway had made the request that this dead end road be vacated and had offered to improve the ten feet north of the vacated forty feet for a pathway for school children. It was shown that proper notices of the proposed vacation and the hearing had been given. There was no citizen present who objected to the vacation and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

MEETING OF JANUARY 9, 1961

COUNCIL CHAMBER

954th MEETING

The nine hundred fifty-fourth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, was held on the ninth day of January, 1961.

The newly elected officers were sworn in by Attorney Sheldahl and took their seats at the Council table.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay.

Present: Mayor Earl Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Charles Renard, E. H. Aebi, and Theron Sedgwick; Manager Leonard Mullan, Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred fifty-third regular meeting of the Council, held on the twelfth day of December, 1960, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-third day of December 1960, were approved as written.

Mr. Delmar Shoop came before the Council and stated that he had made application for multiple family dwellings to be placed on the east 280.6 feet of Lot 24, Rockwood Acres, and that the building permit had been refused. A letter from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, recommending that the property be zoned 3-R-2 had been read at the meeting of December 12, 1960. The Council had referred this matter back to the Planning Commission. The property is not zoned at this time. Attorney Sheldahl stated that at the time property is annexed to the City it is assumed to be 3-R-1 and that this was the assumption of both the Council and the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission had held a public hearing on the proposal to change the zone of this property to 3-R-2 and upon investigation at that time, had learned that the property had never been zoned. Upon investigation of the type of buildings proposed to be built on the property, the Planning Commission had made their recommendation to the Council, that the property be zoned 3-R-2. Mr. Shoop was advised to have his attorney contact Mr. Sheldahl and together they could determine if the multiple dwellings could be placed on the property.

Bids for furnishing the City with Gasoline and fuel oil were opened and read as follows:

It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that the bids be referred to the City Manager and Mayor for further investigation and that the contract be given to the lowest responsible bidder and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the contract. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the annexation of Lots 9 to 16 incl. and 33 to 40 incl., Block 45, MINTHORN ADDITION and called for any objection to the same. There was a group of owners of properties in close proximity to the property in question, which is owned by Messrs. George Doern Sr. and Jr., who stated that they had no objection to the annexation of the property to the City but that they did object to the use that George Doern Jr. had been making of the property, and advised the Council that Mr. Doern was under Court order to cease such use of the property because of contempt of court,
