MEETING OF FEBRUARY 24, 1947

671 MEETING

The six hundred seven-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-fourth day of February 1947.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Roberts, Nelson, and Frady, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Water Supt. Hofmann, Police Chief Delp, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the six hundred seventh regular meeting of the Council, held on the tenth day of February, 1947, were read and approved as read.

Mr. S.E.Espejo came before the Council and requested that Lots 1 and 2, Block 1, Leo's First Addition, now in Zone 3, be changed to Zone 1. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Roberts, that Mr. James present to the City Recorder, a petition requesting the above mentioned change, duly signed by owners of the property in the adjacent Blocks, which, after checking the ownership, the Recorder will turn over to the Planning Commission for their recommendation. Motion carried and so ordered.

A group of citizens from various parts of the City appeared before the Council and made inquiry as to, if and when, sewers would be installed in their respective neighborhoods. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that Engineer Wm. Scott be directed to prepare the boundaries of the proposed sewer district covering that part of Milwaukie not now served by sewers. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder read telegrams from Senators Morse and Cordon and Representative Norblad in which they stated the the Federal Works Agency had approved \$5,000.00 loan for Advance Planning for Sewer disposal plant.

6 It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the Recorder invite Sanitary Engineers to meet with the Council at their next regular meeting and submit their qualifications to do the necessary engineering and survey work in conjunction with the building of a Sewage Disposal Plant for Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

There was some discussion about punch boards. It appeared that only two members of the Council attended the committee meeting on February 12. It was agreed that the committee would meet again

MEETING OF MARCH 10, 1947

672 MEETING

The six hundred seventy-second regular meeting of the Council was held on the tenth day of March 1947.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present. Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Roberts, Nelson, and Frady, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Water Superintendant Hofmann, and Recorder Martin.

Attorney Kirkpatrick reported progress on the preliminary work of the sewer for that part of Milwaukie not now served by sewer.

Bids for furnishing the City with gasoline were opened as follows.

All bids included state tax and excluded Federal Tax.

It was moved by Hamlin seconded by Frady, that, the bid of the Richfield Oil Co. be accepted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Frady, seconded by Roberts that Mr. Ed. Judah be given a contract for cleaning and painting the outside of the water storage tank, the City to furnish the paint and the work to be done at the following prices.

Cleaning tank and applying one coat of paint \$180.00

Cleaning tank and applying two coats of paint \$235.00 Motion carried.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Roberts that the Attorney prepare an ordinance fixing a license fee of \$150.00 per year or any part thereof for operating punch boards in Milwaukie. Motion carried.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the Recorder be instructed to write to the Southern Pacific Co. requesting a license for the City of Milwaukie to use a portion of their property at Railroad Avenue and Oak Street for street purposes, the request to stipulate that the Southern Pacific may revoke the license at
