CORRESPONDENCE

- 1. Letter was read from Oregon Health Division, dated February 23, 1972, awarding a certificate of merit for satisfactory water reports to the Milwaukie Water Department.
- 2. Letter was read from Alice H. Rathofer, 2635 SE Willard Street, asking why there are no trash cans in the park area east of the Milwaukie Library. It was suggested some civic organization might donate trash cans for this purpose.

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REPORT ON PATROLLING OF McLOUGHLIN

Memorandum was read from the Police Chief, dated March 6, 1972, in answer to a request at the last Council meeting that the State Police be requested to patrol McLoughlin and the Expressway.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 5-1972 - RE ONE-WAY ON SECOND STREET

It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Fuller, that Resolution Number 5-1972 (A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING ONE-WAY TRAFFIC ON SECOND STREET) be read. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Fuller, that Resolution 5-1972 be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1254 - AMENDING BUILDING CODE

It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Hupp, that Ordinance Number 1254 (AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 1228, AS AMENDED, BY AMENDING THE UNIFORM BUILDING CODE, VOLUME I, AND THE APPENDIX TO VOLUME I, AND ESTABLISHING AN EMERGENCY) be read the second time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance 1254 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Stochosky, Fuller and Graf. NOES: None. Councilman Hupp abstained from voting. Ordinance 1254 passed the Council, and was so declared by the Mayor.

ESTABLISHING POSITION AND SALARY RANGE FOR POSITION OF FIRE INSPECTOR

X It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Fuller, that the position of Fire Inspector be established, at salary range 18, from \$740 to \$870. Motion carried and so ordered.

ADOPTION OF SEWER RATE STUDY COMMITTEE REPORT

It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Hupp, that the Council accept the financial program for the proposed sewer Local Improvement District, as proposed by the Sewer Assessment Rate Study Committee. Motion carried and so ordered.

OTHER BUSINESS

1. It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Fuller, that the Council commend the workers, including high school and junior high school students, who participated in work to complete Spring Creek Park. Motion carried and so ordered.
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• 2. Memorandum was read, dated March 6, 1972, from City Manager to Mayor and Councilmen, concerning use of public records.

It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Fuller, that the bills listed for March 7,

1972 payment be approved for payment. Motion carried and so ordered.
