Army, Capt. Warner Craig Jacobson, 26, a graduate of Milwaukie High school, will be buried with full military honors in Lincoln Memorial Park Mausoleum, Portland, pending arrival of the body from Vietnam. Capt. Jacobson died June 22 when the military aircraft in which he was a passenger was hit by



automatic weapons fire. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Con Jacobson of Longview, Wash. Born June 4, 1942, in Ogden, Utah, he lived there until 1956, when his family moved to the Northwest. After attending Milwaukie High school, he was graduated from the University of Oregon. During high school he was an exchange student in the Netherlands. He was a career soldier who entered the Army in 1964, spent 13 months in Korea and served in Vietnam as commander of "A" Battery, Third Battalion, 16th Artillery Group, American Division. Survivors in addition to his parents are a brother, Scott, and a sister, Ann, both of Longview; a grandmother, Mrs. Opal Scillian, Waco, Texas, and a grandfather, James E. Jacobson, Ogden, Utah.
