Rebates are available to eligible participants for projects that reduce the energy used in buildings. See our website or call for program details and application forms.

Rebates up to \$4,000 for qualifying projects

Additions, Remodels Retrofits **	Homeowners and renters (with owner's permission)	Insulation upgrades Duct sealing Air sealing	\$150 per qualified measure installed up to \$500 per home.
Savings Within Reach**	Income qualified owners, renters or their participating contractors	Insulation upgrades Duct sealing & testing Air sealing & testing HVAC upgrades	\$35 - \$1,000 depending on upgrades installed. (Rebates are paid directly to contractor to keep out-of-pocket expense low to residents. Call 1.877.395.6757 for list of participating contractors)
Low-Income Weatherization	Income qualified owners or renters in multi-family units, single-family units and mobile homes	The county uses energy audits to determine which upgrades are most appropriate.	FREE weatherization upgrades. (Call Community Solutions of Clackamas County at 503.650.3338 for more information and eligibility requirements)

*ENERGIZE rebates available for projects within Clackamas County that are outside the City of Lake Oswego. **Participants must apply for and receive a rebate from Energy Trust of Oregon, Canby PUD, or the State of Oregon SHOW program to qualify for Clackamas County ENERGIZE rebate. ***ENERGIZE rebates are subject to available funds and are on a first-come, first-served basis.
